As promised, here is the Intergroup report for March, and April.

Since the March meeting co-incided with the G.S.R's Meeting, we did not have a big turn-out, but this could not be helped. However it just points out the need to have a different member of each Group, in a different official capacity.

Of the ten people present, six Groups were represented, and when the subject of the Where and When Cards came up, a spontaneous collection of \$44.00 was given by those present towards the cards for the Intergroup Office. This was another way of showing how A.A. works.

The Revisions on the By-Laws were read and each member was given a copy. Copies were to be sent out to all the Groups.

During March, Intergroup Office received--72 Calls, and had 24--Visitors. The Coordinator also made 37--Follow-Up Calls on Answerphone calls received, and --41 Calls to obtain Speakers, for Groups and A.R.C.
