The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as read. Gerry D. announced that he must resign his newly elected office as Secretary because of scheduling conflicts. His resignation was accepted.

Ted F. read the financial report showing a balance on hand May 31, 1982 of \$572.72. The report was accepted as presented. It was pointed out that the balance is approx. \$120.00 lower than previous month.

NEW BUSINESS

1. The office typewriter is in need of minor repair. It was agreed to take care of this.
2. Question as to printing Intergroup phone number in the Haywood County directory in bold face type at a cost of \$5.50 per month. Following a discussion it was decided by vote that feasibility cost wise was prohibitive.
3. Announcement that Intergroup apologizes for neglecting the Cumberland Ave. meeting in the new "Where and When" pamphlets.
4. Hugh C. announced that he will print up a sheet of additions and/or corrections which may be added to the W/W pamphlets. Groups are advised to get any information into the Intergroup office immediately if they desire a change. The group was also reminded that only 5% of the cards sent out were returned for "Where and When" information.
5. It was noted that Haw Creek and Cumberland Ave. groups share the cost of the classified advertising in the daily newspaper. This represents a monthly contribution.
6. A discussion was held regarding the lack of communication among the groups. It was pointed out that each group member had a responsibility to take information back to their meetings. A discussion followed regarding Service Work, sharing and fellowship growth.
7. The executive committee nominated Curry W. as secretary to begin in July. She was elected by motion and vote.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:10 PM. The next meeting to be held on July 18, at 3:PM at the Mustard Seed Club Room.
