After checking with the local banks, we will go with Asheville Federal which still has free checking for non-profit, beginning January.

## HOW IT WORKS

#### INTERGROUP

What is Intergroup of WNC? What is an Intergroup Representative?

Have you as an AA member been asked these questions? I know I have, which prompts me to look at our by-laws for Intergroup of WNC. (Based on the AA guidelines from GSO)

#### PURPOSES:

- A. To extend the hand of Alcoholics Anonymous to all suffering alcoholics, seeking recovery and to facilitate such activities which will enable "the hand of AA; to be ready when anyone, anywhere, anytime reaches out for help"; and to present the ideal that when such occurs we will be responsible.
- B. To provide communication between all groups of AA within Areas 7 & 8 of North Carolina.
- C. To provide information about AA to the general public concerning the goals and ideals of AA.

#### FUNCTIONS:

- A. Operate a central office in Asheville including adequate office space, phone service, and the employment and supervision of an office coordinator.
- B. Arrange with and Asheville telephone service to handle AA calls when the central office is closed.
- C. Maintain a current confidential list of Area 7 & 8 AA members willing to perform twelfth step work.
- D. Maintain a current confidential list and assist in obtaining speakers for AA and no-AA groups in Areas 7 & 8.
- E. On an annual basis, update and distribute information regarding the times, dates, and places of AA group meetings in Areas 7 & 8.
- F. Engage in public information and public relations which serve to attract rather than promote AA.
- G. Cooperate with other Area 7 & 8 community agencies which deal with alcoholism.

- H. Serve as a clearing house for information regarding the activities of AA groups within Areas 7 & 8.
- I. Monthly publication of "Mountain Doin's".
- J. Appoint special committees as necessary, to carry out the implementation of Intergroup action.

#### MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING

- A. Intergroup of WNC is a service organization available to AA groups in Areas 7 & 8.
- B. Each participating AA group shall designate a representative to attend all business and special meetings. It is suggested that these representatives serve for one year term beginning in January each year.
- C. The Intergroup Representative or in his absense, his alternate, the elected Intergroup Officers, and the Coordinator shall have one vote. Action shall be taken by those pressent and any scheduled meeting ad a two-thirds majority vote of those present is required for the passage of all motions.

Being an Intergroup Representative for your group is a wonderful way to do AA service work. Does your group have an Intergroup Representative? We need your participation. Intergroup meetings are open to anyone in AA, if you want to visit. Mark your calendar for the third Sunday of each month at 3:p.m. at St. Joan of Arc Church, 919 Haywood Road, West Asheville and come to the meetings.

New Intergroup Reps will be starting in January, we hope to see your group represented.
