

The North Carolina Mountain Central Office Board, elected by the Central Office Representatives Committee ("the CORs"), serves the Western North Carolina A.A. community. The NCMCO Board has several openings for service to the A.A. community. The required minimum sober time is two years continuously; previous experience in an elected A.A. position is desirable. Qualified candidates (excepting the hiring of the office manager) are chosen by the Board and may only be *disqualified* by the CORs in a two-thirds *disapproval* vote.

Secretary

The Secretary shall take minutes of all COR and Central Office Board meetings and have copies of same within 14 days available at the Central Office's customary place of business, provide timely written notice of the meetings of the Committees, shall have charge of the books, records and papers of the North Carolina Mountain Central Office with the responsibility of filing same in the Office Manager's office. Shall see that reports, statements and other documents required by law are properly kept and filed. This is an unpaid, volunteer position.

Treasurer

The Treasurer has charge and custody of all funds of Central Office, ensures the accuracy of all financial records of Central Office, arranges for preparation and filing of all required tax returns and an annual financial report, and prepares a monthly financial report and presents it to the Central Office Board and COR Committee. This is an unpaid, volunteer position.



Making All Things New For the New Year

People who live virtuous lives expect to see goodness unfolding in their path. They live lives that are near-perfect, virtuous, and work out almost mathematically. In A.A., our lives stumble into goodness without much planning or discipline or virtue. We cannot do the math and see our way to a much deserved reward. In fact, when we do the math, all we see is the cruel justice of paying the piper at the end. So what is the formula?

The formula is simple. If you want to have a life filled with meaning, it can start immediately--even if you are sober and in your first 24 hours. To live even a few hours without a drink is useful to others who know us. When I say that my name is Jim, I am an alcoholic, and I did not drink today, it is an expression of wealth beyond my wildest dreams. I could not imagine life, not even a day, without a drink.

Alcohol made my life have purpose and then it began to take everything away. It took me to places that left me filled with shame and full of self-hatred. It took away any ability I had to love anyone and anything and it left me with this horrible sense of self-loathing. When I had nowhere else to turn, it made me lie, cheat, steal, and act in ways that were instinct driven. It committed me to a life of being shocked by myself. I came to believe that I had nothing to offer to anyone, not even my own children.

One day as, I drifted along without a rudder or an oar, a person told me about themselves. They too had drank alcohol like me. They too had lived a life that shocked them just like me. They told me their story in enough detail so that I could say, "that was me." That was the moment that I began to receive the lavish inheritance that we receive in the rooms of A.A.

It is more than backwards to find out that the very behaviors and experiences that made me feel so depraved could be liberating to others. Once I could get a full estimation of my defects I could begin by sharing those deep dark despicable secrets with someone else. When I did this I was greeted with the words of liberation that I never ever expected to hear ever, "Yes, I did that too," usually followed by a chuckle.

I had backed into a goldmine. I had a brother. I wanted to tell everyone, but quickly realized as I tried that not everyone was ready. I told my Dad but he was not impressed. I tried to tell a lady who I drank with but she was trying to convince me that she could never be as bad as me. I hit a wall. Finally, my sponsor gave me a secret. "You want to help people?" he said. I told him that I did but no one wanted to hear what I had to say. "Listen," he said, "just listen."

I realized that this was a new concept. It was his listening that allowed me to see my garbage as useful. I didn't know that once I could live without secrets, I would no longer be afraid to listen. My fear of listening had to do with the fact that I might hear my own secrets and my own secrets terrified me. Now I wasn't deafened by my own judgments upon myself.

Do you want to make all things new in the New Year? Trust in God, clean house, and listen. Perhaps you will hear a new secret whispered from deep inside, penetrating your stone-cold heart with the words, "I love you."
