

From Wikipedia.com In the field of telecommunications, a *central office* is the physical building used to house inside plant equipment including telephone switches, which make telephone calls "work" in the sense of making connections and relaying the speech information.

The **North Carolina Mountain Central Office** maintains a phone line (the local A.A. "hotline") so that the suffering alcoholic can reach a recovering alkie—not to mention get meeting info, order literature, and learn of local A.A. events.

From the General Service Office's A.A. Guidelines – Central Offices or Intergroups A central office (or intergroup) is an A.A. service office that involves **partnership among groups** in a community—just as A.A. groups themselves are partnerships of individuals. A central office is established to carry out certain functions common to all the groups—functions which are best handled by a centralized office—and it is usually **maintained**, **supervised**, **and supported by these groups** in their general interest. It exists to aid the groups in their common purpose of carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

The Evolution of Anonymity

As A.A.'s early members gained experience with anonymity, it took on new meanings—in their personal lives, in their groups, and in the world at large. Here are a few excerpts that reflect the changing views, from a simple description to the spiritual foundation of life.

We do not know who first used ["Alcoholics Anonymous"]. After we New Yorkers had left the Oxford Groups in 1937 we often described ourselves as "a nameless bunch of alcoholics." From this phrase it was only a step to the idea..." —Bill W., A.A. Comes of Age

Still fearful of being stigmatized, they [alcoholics and their families] regard our anonymity as an assurance their problems will be kept confidential; that the alcoholic skeleton in the family closet will not wander the streets. —Bill W., *AA Grapevine*, March 1946

Anonymity is "the sure key to all the rest of our Traditions...True consideration for the newcomer if he desires to be nameless; vital protection against the misuse of the name Alcoholics Anonymous at the public level; and to each of us a constant reminder that principles come before personal interest—such is the wide scope of this all-embracing principle. In it we see the cornerstone of our security as a movement, at a deeper spiritual level it points us to still greater self-renunciation. —Bill W., AA Grapevine, November 1948

Anonymity protects the reputation of AA from public criticism not only of "slips" but also of failures, internal tensions, and all deviant behavior...Equally important, anonymity keeps the groups from exploiting prominent



names for the sake of group prestige; and it keeps individual members from exploiting their AA connection for personal prestige or fame...It encourages honest catharsis and utter frankness.—Milton Maxwell, The Washingtonian Movement

AA members generally think it unwise to break the anonymity of a member even after his death, but in each situation the final decision must rest with the family. —1971 GSC Advisory Action, reaffirmed in 1988


