Though not costly, these service agencies are absolutely essential to our continued expansion—to our survival as a Fellowship. Our support of services actually amounts to a recognition on our part that AA must everywhere function in full strength—and that, under our tradition of self-support, we are all going to foot the bill.


caught a whiff like that since Marty J. had come around.


