

I Saw It All: Stories from the 75th International Convention

Hi, my name is Monique, I'm an alcoholic and my sobriety date is November 14, 2003. Asheville Big Book Step Study is my home group, I have a sponsor and I'm an alternate COR.

I'd like to share with you one of the most amazing experiences of my life. I was blessed to attend the 75th International AA Convention, in San Antonio, over the July 4th weekend. It was mindboggling that total strangers from all over the world and of different cultural backgrounds were capable of becoming instant friends through a common language. Everywhere I looked I saw smiling faces, laughter, and new friendships being formed.

From day classes to night dances, my schedule was packed with fun workshops, speakers, AA shopping, dancing, drinking coffee, and sharing meals with newly made friends. I ran from one workshop to the next as fast as I could, not wanting to miss a single thing.

The Grapevine workshop was especially inspiring because I didn't realize I could submit pictures and written experiences to them for possible publication (I thought, "Wow, a drunk like me, published in the Grapevine—that would be something incredible!").

The meetings in the Alamodome were breath taking. I looked with awe across the sea of happy faces, realizing I was not alone, but surrounded by my HP and thousands of people who had come to share their experi-

ence, strength and hope with one another. Words cannot begin to describe the love and acceptance I felt that special weekend.

Relationships & The Family

Recently I went on a vacation with my family. Like other vacations, weddings, and funerals, everyone was freely talking about the people in their life. Not me, I didn't even feel it appropriate to mention her name. It was not until near the end of the trip that she was even briefly pointed out. After over sixteen years as a loosely knit couple, no one acknowledged her. If it had been up to me I would have brought her along.

We met on Valentine's Day 1994 and we were both at work that evening. I approached her and asked, "What is a pretty little thing like you working on Valentines Day Night?" We went out later that evening and in two weeks we were a couple. Everything was alright until Autumn of 2003 when we both began to experiment with alcohol and drugs. Things quickly tore apart. We both separately began our roads into recovery in 2005. By 2009 we were a couple again, and now it seems as if things are near where they were in the 1990's. But I suppose that the family will always view us in that slot of bad times. Never mind the preceding nine years of happiness. I can't fix my relatives nor their viewpoints. Now all I can do is grow, a bit more divided in the family however, but growing nevertheless. Acceptance. -R.

In Memoriam

January 16, 1929– July 18,2010

Allan (Alan) Hepburn, co-founder, with his wife Beth, of the Early Bird Group in Flat Rock, died on July 18, 2010. A memorial service, well attended by his AA friends, was held on July 25. Allan came to us from the UK in the late 1980's and regularly attended meetings of several area groups in the area. About three years ago his Alzheimer's reached a point at which he was unable to attend. He kept us entertained, educated and encouraged with his many sea stories and memories of his UK sponsor, Mick. The following is from a letter from his son, John, which was read at the memorial service: "He had a difficult time after Mum died, and went to stay with his mother, Annie, in Hendersonville, where he eventually settled and was remarried, to Beth and then Maggie. You will have many memories of him from that time on. I know that he felt at home with you all, and that AA in particular provided him with a sense of belonging and of purpose. At this time it is customary to ignore someone's faults. But in Dad's case it is right to remember that, like all of us, he was not without them. And in remembering that we can remember that in dealing with his own alcoholism he inspired others and helped them overcome their own failings."

The principles of the Ninth Tradition...make sure that love continues to flow outward. Early members started The Alcoholic Foundation, now the General Service Board, to ensure the long-term fiscal and policy integrity of our Fellowship. They organized a Headquarters Office, now known as the General Service Office. They started Works Publishing, now known as AA World Services, Inc. to handle our publishing and services. They implemented the General Service Conference as the successor to our co-founders and early members.

Over the years AA has developed a network of service entities: areas, districts, groups, committees on Public Information, Literature, Corrections, Treatment Facilities, Cooperation with the Professional Community, Hospitals and Institutions, Young People, Elder Communities, Bridging The Gap, Special Need/Accessibilities and similar issues.


