Since I am a turtle on the winding road that leads ever inward, I have always appreciated the "Spiritual Awakening" appendix in the Big Book; it has helped me to make sense of so many things. Some of my favorite descriptions of the spiritual awakening I've heard in meetings: "the realization that there was something inside myself that I wanted to preserve," and "the realization that other people really existed, they weren't just shadows," the realization that "I'm not God and that I don't have to be," and many, many more.

For me, it has been the re-introduction to my soul and the realization over much trial and error, that that "island within" cannot be accessed when I am full of resentment and fear; that it is not my mind, it is not my image, it is not my body, it is not my feelings—it is a place of respite, of joy, of sweetness, it is the very center of the universe and holds every answer to every question I have. When I can get there, and stay there for a while, it rejuvenates me in ways I cannot put into words. I get intuitive thoughts and ideas that I have no explanation for, and I am reminded of the connectedness of all of us, as well as the magic that exists in this world just beneath the surface of things. Now, if I could find the way to stay there and not fall spiritually back into sleep, I'm sure life would be pleasant even more often than it is now. So my awakening continues. Every day I need to rouse that part of myself, there are days when I face very deep pain and need to work through those old lessons, but most days, it's just having the presence to pause and go to that place, ask for help when I can't, listen to the suggestions I get, and take the actions I need to. The great news in all of this is that miracles happen every day in my life and there is always some success even in the midst of failure; the island is always there and it produces incredible abundance—if only I am willing and able to listen.
