

That meant digging into dark places I hadn't wanted to look at before. With the help of a sponsor and the Big Book, I can do that. Whenever life feels unfair, I know I can look for the selfishness that is keeping me from relying on my Higher Power. And it is only by honestly facing my flaws that I can grow in sobriety. -ST
