Speaking at A.A. Meetings

A letter in three installments.

ur stories disclose in a general way what we used to be like, what happened, and what we are like now." (Big Book, p. 58)

It is my experience that when speaking at A.A. speaker meetings saying your name (first and last—see what Bill and Bob said about "anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films), what you are (alcoholic), and your sobriety date is helpful in influencing the listening audience to identify with your story. If you don't know enough about the traditions (both written and unwritten) to follow them why should I pay attention to anything that you say after your introduction?

Members who have "recovered from [that] seemingly hopeless state of mind and body" a long time before you came into the fellowship can also help you afterward to pinpoint areas in your recovery that might need a little extra attention. You will be helping them, so relax and "take it easy" and listen—it might keep you from drinking. A loving, helpful suggestion is a good thing, right? That's one of the meanings of "going to any lengths." After all, you're still willing to accept help and to grow spiritually aren't you?

If you want to identify yourself as an alcoholic and an "and a" (alcoholic and addict, alcoholic and sex maniac, grateful recovering alcoholic, etc.) that's fine, however we in A.A. can't help your "and a" problem. Many people in the audience won't be able to identify with your "and a" and this makes you much less effective as a speaker at an A.A. meeting. That's one of the meanings of the concept (and practice) of "singleness of purpose." In A.A. we focus on alcoholism and don't try to cure the rest of the world's ills. Speaking of which, you might want to take that "and a" issue to another fellowship (or therapy group) that can help you with that specific life problem.
