






Dear BTG Volunteers,
I hope you can all attend the service committee meeting this coming Tuesday at 6 p.m. at Trinity Episcopal Church.
Just a few notes on the status of Bridging the Gap.

As the coordinator, I am generally quite busy trying to find bridges for people who call the toll free number looking for help. I know that half a dozen people a month doesn't sound like a lot, but it is often difficult finding contacts for people who live in rural areas of North Carolina, where the closest meeting is twenty miles away.

Some of the communities that people are going back to are lucky to have A.A. let alone Bridging the Gap. In some cases I am calling people who haven't volunteered to do any more than answer a phone and give the time and location of the closest meeting. It is almost impossible to get phone numbers of other A.A.'s from these people because they are protecting anonymity. I usually leave my number and am depending on them to call their friends and get them to call me back. Then I have to explain BTG to them (when and if they do call) and try to sell them on being a temporary sponsor for someone they have never met.

The half dozen or so clients I deal with per month does not take into account the calls I get from people who have gotten their hands on our pamphlet and call to ask for info about meetings, or the calls I get from family members of clients who are concerned about their loved ones and want to know about A.A. and Bridging the Gap.

Then come the presentations. Most of the area facilities have had BTG presentations and/or know about our program. When I can schedule presentations with them I do, but it is sometimes difficult to make contact with them and find a mutually agreeable time to present. The problem is that for the most part, these facilities already have a very full schedule of classes and activities and the administrators are always very busy. In other words, they are not sitting around waiting for me to call and drop in at any time.

I have had several cancellations from different facilities and have to reschedule the presentations sometimes. This happened recently with Men's First Step Farm. The men's farm recently changed our contact person and we are waiting to hear word about our next presentation opportunity. The next presentation will likely be at Neil Dobbins this coming week, for the staff only.

When I joined BTG last August, we had several people willing to be liasons with the different facilities. They would be responsible for organizing the presentation at their assigned facility, making contact with the facility and giving the presentation on a regular basis. These volunteers seem to have disappeared.

I am eager to have more volunteers for presentations (we have an abundance of temporary sponsors). I hope that anyone interested will attend a presentation so that they can start making presentations on their own. I have had one presentation this past month. It was at Swain on the Saturday after the last service meeting. I announced that presentation at the service meeting on February 28th and invited all to attend. It was short notice and nobody was able to make it, but most of these things are scheduled on short notice.

I was hoping for more activity with this program by now. August is just around the corner and my position will be up for grabs. I am likely moving to New Jersey in August and would like to leave the program in capable hands
