

Then, too, we view with much concern those A.A. treasuries which continue, beyond prudent reserves, to accumulate funds for no stated A.A. purpose. Experience has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over property, money, and authority. —Tradition Seven (long form)

<u>The AA Member-Medications & Other Drugs</u>

- The experience of some AA members reveals that drug misuse can threaten the achievement and maintenance of sobriety. Experience has shown that this problem can be minimized if the following suggestions are carefully heeded:
- 1 Remember that as a recovering alcoholic your automatic response will be to turn to chemical relief for uncomfortable feelings and to take more than the usual, prescribed amount. Look for non-chemical solutions for the aches and discomforts of everyday living.
- **2** Remember that the best safeguard against drug-related relapse is an active participation in the AA program of recovery.
- 3 No AA member plays doctor.
- **4** Be completely honest with yourself and your physician regarding use of medication.
- **5** If in doubt, consult a physician with demonstrated experience in the treatment of alcoholism.
- **6** Be frank about your alcoholism with any physician or dentist you consult. Such confidence will be respected and is most helpful to the doctor.
- **7** Inform the physician at once if you experience side effects from prescribed drugs.
- **8** Consider consulting another doctor if a personal physician refuses or fails to recognize the peculiar susceptibility of alcoholics to sedatives, tranquilizers, and stimulants.
- 9 Give your doctor copies of this pamphlet."

12-Stepping at Central Office: An Update

September 4 marked the first evening in a long while that the Central Office "A.A. Hotline" was answered by two sober alcholics instead of a paid answering service.

For years now, Central Office has been paying a service to route calls made to Central Office whenever the Office is closed (our manager switches the phone over to the service as she's locking up). The way it works is, a (non-alcoholic) operator takes that caller's information then starts calling A.A.s who are on our **Step 12 Call List**, to try to find someone who will talk with that caller. The answering service's meter starts ticking when the operator answers the call and it doesn't stop until she or he finds **an A.A. willing**

to talk to that caller. (Remember, NCMCO pays for this outside service—these answering-service operators are not A.A.s; their job is to connect callers with A.A.s on the Step 12 Call List).

The COR (Central Office Representatives) ad-hoc committee asks that a "sponsor group" recruits two 12-steppers to take calls **at the Office** from 6:00–9:00 pm. Taking calls there keeps the 12-stepper's **phone number private**—a concern

for many of A.A.'s members.

To keep the trial run organized, we ask that groups consider "sponsoring" a month's worth of a weeknight. A group can recruit a rotating roster of two sober group members to man the phone in our "Back Office." (How about someone with time and a newer member?)

Central Office's back room is a pleasant space, with plenty of room, A.A. literature, up-to-date meeting information (of course!), and a few handy guidelines. Would your group like to take on a month of October Wednesdays (or November Thursdays...)? If interested, or if you'd like more info, call the committee coordinator, Cathy B., at (828) 458-1529.
