

::Carry the Message::

A s in Western North Carolina are working hard to "carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers." This new, monthly column, will highlight current outreach efforts by groups and districts. Each of these efforts is open to all A.A.s—they are opportunities for you to get involved in service! November's featured service activity is **Bridging the Gap** in District 70.

You might be asking yourself what, exactly, is this "gap"? That's easy to answer: the gap is the space between *treatment* (that is, non-A.A. centers that specialize in short- or long-term housing for newly sober people) and *Alcoholics Anonymous itself*. **Bridging the Gap** is an A.A. service structure that helps connect the about-to-be-discharged person with a temporary recovery contact in A.A. Many of our region's treatment centers are now actively working with A.A.s to get their clients connected with volunteer A.A.s (like you!). These include Neil Dobbins, Swain, Memorial Mission Hospital, and ADATC (in Black Mountain). Way to go, A.A. and **Bridging the Gap**!

::To All Groups::

The Executive Board of the North Carolina Mountain Central Office (NCMCO) is facing a difficult decision—whether to restructure because of unfilled vacancies and less than ideal participation, or continue to operate as is and risk losing the cohesiveness and commitment necessary to fulfill its function as the crossroads of Intergroup 12-Step action, communication, and services.

Of the three Trustee positions from Districts 70, 71, and 80 who are part of the Board, only two are filled and only one has attended regularly. In January two other positions, that of Alternate Chair and Secretary, will become vacant because those members are "rolling off" their two-year commitment (which has stretched to three years in some cases). Already this year there have been several Board meetings where a quorum was not present and Board business could not be conducted as it should be.

At present, the Board meets monthly, but is only partially constituted with two (out of the needed three) Trustees, the Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary. In addition, the office manager also attends. We have not had a Step 12 Call List Coordinator at all this year. A suggestion for restructuring would be to lower the number of Trustees to one and to reduce meeting frequency to four times a year. This is, of course, only one possibility. Since this issue affects all of Districts 70, 71, and 80, it is essential that A.A.s make their opinions and suggestions known.

The issue will be brought up at the January 31, 2013, Central Office Representatives meeting. We urge you to contact the COR of your group or plan to attend the meeting to ensure that your voice is heard.
