

It did not take long to drink myself out of the job with the cabinet factory. Zeke was now working as a backhoe operator for a plumbing company, and he managed to get me hired there to be an assistant ditchdigger.

A Report to District 70 on the January 2013 COR Meeting

by the District 70 Webmaster, Danny S.

The meeting started at 2pm and ended at 4pm. There were 11 people in attendance: the Office Manager, Cindy C., Chair of Board/Newsletter Editor, Suzanne T., Alt Chair, George D. as well as several GSRs and CORs. No Trustees were present and several board members were also absent. The meeting was held at the [new location of] "Central Office," not at Chunns Cove.

Majority of discussion was about 12 Step Call efforts, which need support as the phone list is outdated. A new call list is being updated by Gene S., who is taking a proactive approach to resolving past issues with volunteer availability. Contact Cindy at the office via email info@ncmco.net or phone 254-8539 to UPDATE on Gene's list.

Board members will be meeting with Daniels this week to review call center support policy and procedures, etc. Additional suggestions were made about how to keep the calls that go to the answering service from being as costly and time consuming.

Support and volunteers needed: Friday from 10am–1pm, Volunteer Needed; Secretary Position open, 2 years' sobriety suggested; Treasurer Position open, 5 years' sobriety suggested.

Lack of attendance and support from Groups/districts and unfilled / unattended board member positions

Trustees: There is one trustee position that has been unfilled for over 2 yrs, another for [over a year]. Currently, Trustees are representatives of each district and are elected by the board and CORs. Trustees are voting members of the board.

CORs: There has been LOW turnout for CORs for years now. The Board proposes to remove the COR position completely and replace it with an OPEN QUARTERLY MEET-ING. This would be open to GSRs and A.A. members in Districts 70/71/80. It would be the conduit for information between the Office and Districts/Groups. The attendees would have a right to discuss items and approve them, or ask for group conscious if need-ed. This would take place once each quarter as part of the regular Board Meetings.

The Board also proposes to eliminate the trustee positions, as they are currently defined, and place responsibility with each district for their trustees. The board is requesting that Board Trustee positions for Districts 70/71/80 be the Districts' individual responsibility. Each District would elect its own trustee and define that position's requirements and duties as they pertain to their district's needs. The Trustee would still be a voting member of the Office Board.

It was further suggested that the trustee position might also serve as a replacement for the COR position. For example; each trustee would report back to their district business meetings to share information and when needed ask for GSRs to get Group Conscious on matters affecting other groups or AA as a whole, thereby allowing transparency and fluid communication between the Board and the Districts it serves. This would eliminate the need for an "Open Board Meeting" and encourage better participation across all areas that are currently neglected.

These items were tabled until the next Central Office Meeting to allow the COR/GSRs present to bring the items to their groups (and/or the District Meeting) for an Informed Group Conscious.
