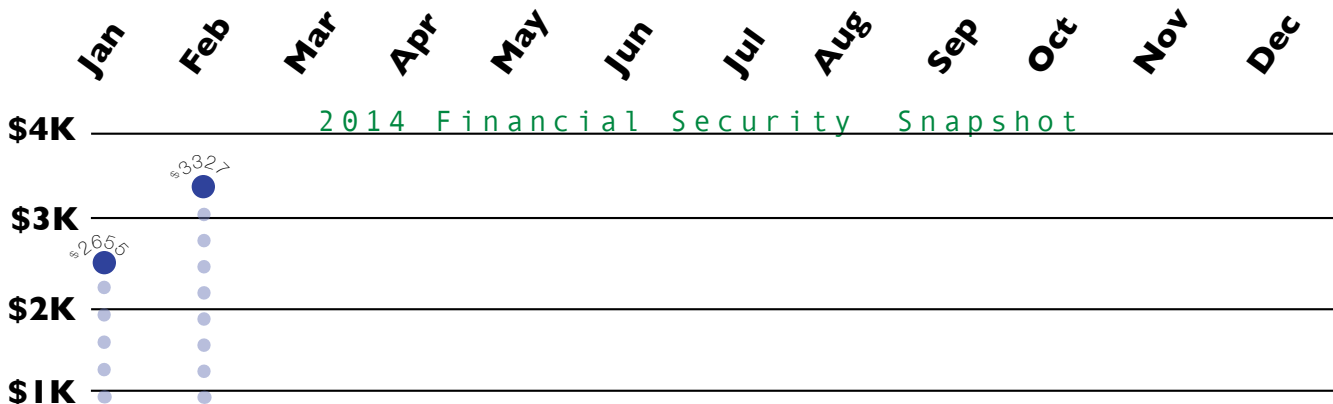
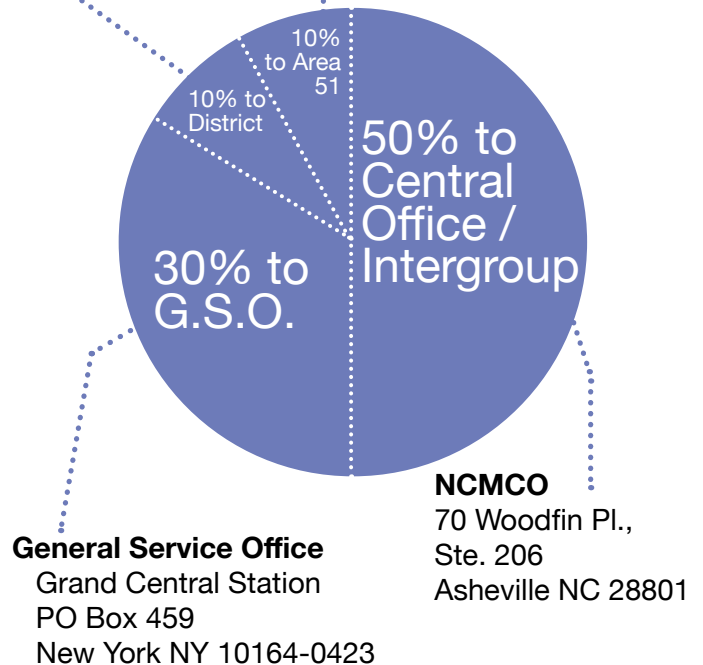

2013 AAWS (GSO) Financials: Report given by Rachel M., Alternate Delegate. Contributions in 2013 were \$6.9 million, 4% greater than 2012, 3% above the budget. Great progress in self-support for all of the US and Canada! Literature sales for 2013 were \$12.6 million, slightly above budget and 2.0% above last year. Expenses were slightly below budget and \$625,000 above last year, which included increased Pension Plan funding. AAWS has budgeted a profit of \$295,000 in 2014, including a price increase effective 10/01.

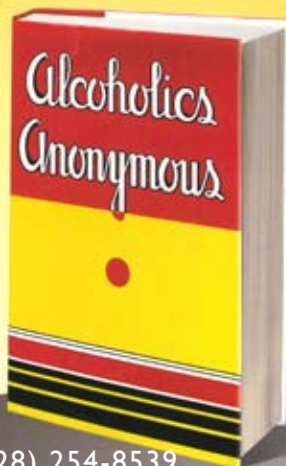

Small, But Mighty: Leicester Group Celebrates 28 Years

In January 2014, the Leicester Group celebrated its 28th anniversary. The group's very first meeting was held on January 22, 1986, at the Leicester Community Center and was chaired by Tracey T. The group continued to meet in its original location, on Wednesdays, at 8:00 pm, for the following 19 years. In 2005, the group moved to nearby Bell Methodist Church, on the corner of Old Newfound Road and Leicester Highway (8.3 miles north of Patton Avenue, in Asheville.) In its 22nd year, on November 1, 2008, the Leicester Group began offering a second weekly meeting, on Saturday nights. It continues to this day. Both meetings are now held at 7:00 pm; the Wednesday meeting is a closed discussion format and the Saturday meeting is an open discussion type.

Many AAs have attended the Leicester Group throughout its long history, but it has a relatively small core of home group members who have always warmly welcomed the newcomer and old-timer alike. The group's unofficial motto is "Small, But Mighty," a saying coined by Gene M., one of the group's founders. Many other early members, many of them from Madison County AA groups, were instrumental in helping to start the Leicester Group. Early members included: Ken A., Gene M., Malcolm O., Grady O., Walter S., Tracy T., M.V. and Lucille C., Harold F., Roy H., Ray B., Nelson A., Ruby G., Anne F., Gretchen J., Sharon W., Wayne W., and David H. As the group's written history states, "Without their help, there would be no meeting here tonight for us to attend."

The Leicester Group is fortunate because its group history was recorded in a unique and lasting way, passed down from the earliest members. Beginning back in 1986, important group information was written in the group copy of the Big Book, on the inside covers and the first and last blank pages. Members also signed their names and listed their sobriety dates in this Big Book, making these pages a handwritten archive of AA's 28-year history in the Leicester area. The group has also preserved its history by archiving the minutes from its monthly business meetings.

In the early days of the group, one of its unique customs was to give a silver dollar to group members on their personal AA anniversaries, with a new hole drilled into the same silver dollar for each year of sobriety. As the group

grew, and the sober years and decades accumulated, each member's silver dollar had less and less room remaining for new holes to be drilled (a good thing!), so eventually the group switched to presenting standard bronze AA medallions on group members' birthdays.

In early 1986, when the group was first getting started, there might be only one or two people attending the meeting. Gene M. recalled that he and Ken A. would open the building, but would wait before turning on the heat or making

the coffee, in case no one else showed up. To solve the problem of potential AAs having trouble finding the meeting, which was in a building set back from the road, Malcolm O. donated a large handmade sign to the group. The sign was placed at the driveway entrance and featured the letters "AA," three feet tall, hand-cut from plywood and painted bright white, so it could easily be seen by cars passing by on Leicester Highway.

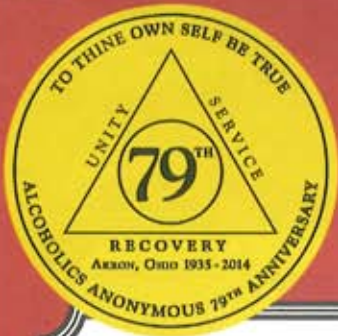
In the following months, two newcomers—David H. and Grady O.—found the meeting and soon made it their home group. While still new in sobriety, David agreed to become the group's treasurer, not realizing at the time that he would hold this service position for the next 21 years, except for a brief six-month break when he served in the Gulf War, during which Grady took over as interim treasurer. For many years, guitar players David H., Dan C., and a few others would practice "pickin' and singin'" together as appreciative home group members and other friends began to arrive earlier and earlier, to listen and to socialize at the "meeting before the meeting." In April of 2008, some members of the group branched out and formed a new group, the Three Alarm Group, which meets on Thursdays at a different location on Leicester Highway.

The Leicester Group would like to thank all those who have attended their meetings over the last 28 years. Members and friends each have contributed their unique individuality to our primary purpose, and have added richness to our shared history and shared sobriety.
