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



12-Step Phone Volunteers Needed in Western North Carolina

Suggested that AA members have 1 year of sobriety and belong to a home group.

"I am responsible. When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of A.A. always to be there. And for that: I am responsible."*

Our North Carolina Mountain Central Office (NC-MCO) in Asheville has an AA member who is the Coordinator for the "12-Step Call List"—covering most of Western NC. That list consists of AA members who volunteer to be phoned when an alcoholic reaches out for help.

When a call for help is received at Central Office—or at the after-hours answering service (hotline)—an AA 12-Step volunteer is called and given the phone number of the person asking for help – AA members' phone numbers are *not* given out.

"Practical experience shows that nothing will so much insure immunity from drinking as intensive work with other alcoholics. It works when other activities fail....Carry this message to other alcoholics! You can help when no one else can. You can secure their confidence when others fail." —*Alcoholics Anonymous*, p. 89



Why Staying at Our Host Hotel is Important

A Message from the Area 51 Chair

Winter 2014

Typically, Area 51 host hotels charge meeting room fees based on the number of guest rooms our attendees occupy. For every Assembly, Committee Meeting and Convention, Area 51 has a contract that specifies the number of guest rooms the hotel will "block" for our use. If we fill at least 85% of our room block, our meeting space is *free*. Otherwise, we are charged on a sliding scale according to how far short of the 85% mark we fall. Free meeting space is what Area 51 budgets and what we usually achieve. However, more than once we have come up short and paid a steep price. From July 2013 until August 2015 we will operate under contracts with the Hilton North Raleigh/Midtown in Raleigh. The chart below shows the meeting space charges we could incur for each event if we fail to meet our room block. ¹

Area 51 makes every effort to negotiate the most favorable room rates possible. But budget hotels don't have the kind of meeting space we require, and as the chart above shows, space in higher-end hotels is expensive. The willingness of individuals to attend Area events and to book their rooms at our host hotel is essential in making Area events affordable at all.

So please attend the Area events you can, and stay at the host hotel using the group code and name whenever possible. If there is an extra cost, please consider it as a contribution to Area 51—a small sacrifice for our "common welfare," which really must come first if we are to continue meeting and working together to fulfill our Primary Purpose as an Area.

² Expressed as "room nights". A room night is one night's stay in one room. For example, 31 rooms booked for 2 nights each would yield 62 room nights.


