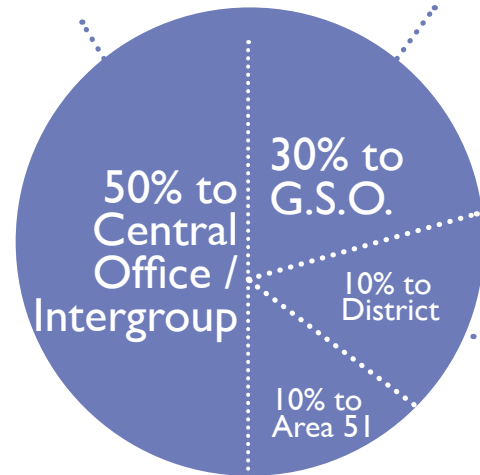

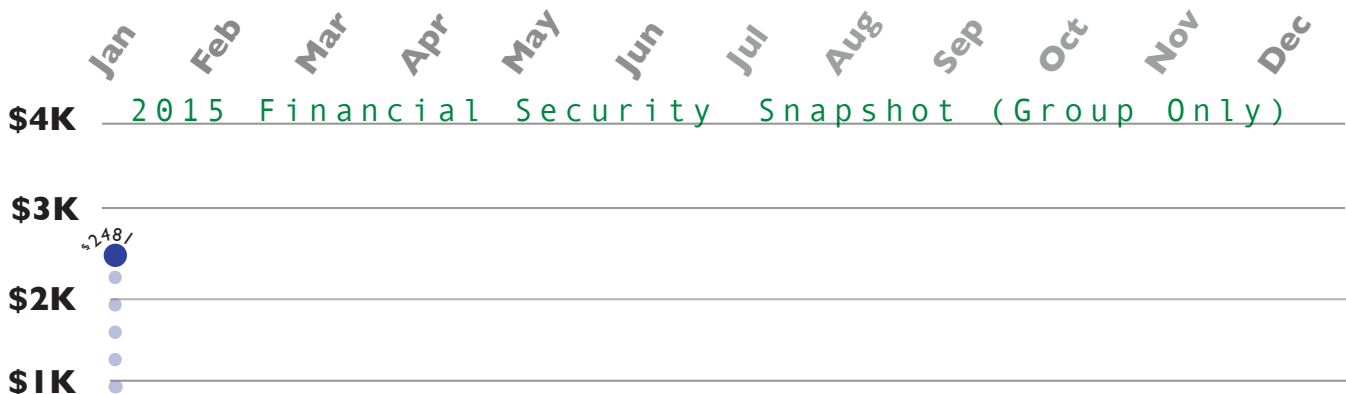

“Conference-approved” — What It Means to You

The term “Conference-approved” describes written or audiovisual material approved by the Conference for publication by G.S.O. This process assures that everything in such literature is in accord with A.A. principles. Conference-approved material always deals with the recovery program of Alcoholics Anonymous or with information about the A.A. Fellowship.

The term has no relation to material not published by G.S.O. It does not imply Conference disapproval of other material about A.A. A great deal of literature helpful to alcoholics is published by others, and A.A. does not try to tell any individual member what he or she may or may not read.

Conference approval assures us that a piece of literature represents solid A.A. experience. Any Conference-approved booklet or pamphlet goes through a lengthy and painstaking process, during which a variety of A.A.s from all over the United States and Canada read and express opinions at every stage of production.

How To Tell What Is and What Is Not Conference-approved

Look for the statement on books, pamphlets and films: “This is A.A. General Service Conference-approved literature”

Not All “A.A. Literature” Is Conference-Approved

Central offices and intergroups do write and distribute pamphlets or booklets that are not Conference-approved. If such pieces meet the needs of the local membership, they may be legitimately classified as “A.A. literature.” There is no conflict between A.A. World Services, Inc. (A.A.W.S. — publishers of Conference-approved literature), and central offices or intergroups — rather, they complement each other. *The Conference does not disapprove of such material.*

G.S.O. does develop some literature that does not have to be approved by the Conference, such as service material, Guidelines and bulletins.

Intergroup/Central Offices: A.A.'s Front Line (submitted by Helen)

“... Both Bill and his fellow A.A. cofounder Dr. Bob early saw that ‘to save whole areas from turmoil, small offices had to be set up, telephones installed, and a few full-time secretaries hired.... If they weren’t, the man coming in the door couldn’t get a break.’” (*Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions*, p. 161) The early service centers were plagued by a lack of money, space, help and an abundance of conflicting opinions, but still they persevered.

“Nothing in A.A. today is original. Everything we know and do to help the suffering alcoholic find sobriety came from our predecessors, whether the Oxford Group or intergroup/central office workers who came before and shared freely of their spiritual experiences and common sense gained the hard way.

“...Unity is the glue that holds the intergroup/central offices and general services together, but it is communication that jumpstarts mutual cooperation and harmony—vital both in reaching suffering alcoholics and in being attuned to the needs of those who are recovering in A.A. Many local intergroups produce their own flyers or information pieces. Also, the General Service Office publishes Guidelines and other service material that share the accumulated experience of intergroups and central offices in the United States-Canada and world-wide. These define an intergroup as ‘an A.A. service office that involves partnership among groups in a community—just as A.A. groups themselves are partnerships of individuals. It is established to carry out functions which are best handled by a centralized office. ...It exists to aid the groups in their common purpose of carrying the Alcoholics Anonymous message to the alcoholic who still suffers.’”

Thought I'd share information I learned at the Area 51 Pre-Conference Meeting last fall in Boone. It was during the Corrections break-out discussion on the topic of revisions of ‘What AA Does NOT Do’ in the pamphlet ‘A Message to Corrections Professionals’—revisions to be more consistent with similar text in CPC literature. The following is an excerpt from correspondence with Public Information at General Service Office in New York:

“Neither A.A.W.S. nor G.S.O. “sanctions” anything in A.A. – regardless of whether they are A.A. groups, committees, events, etc. Each A.A. entity [Group, District, Central Office/Intergroup] is autonomous. However, it may be helpful to know that we [at PI, GSO] consider something to be “A.A.” if it is “put on by A.A.s, for A.A.s, and is about A.A.”
