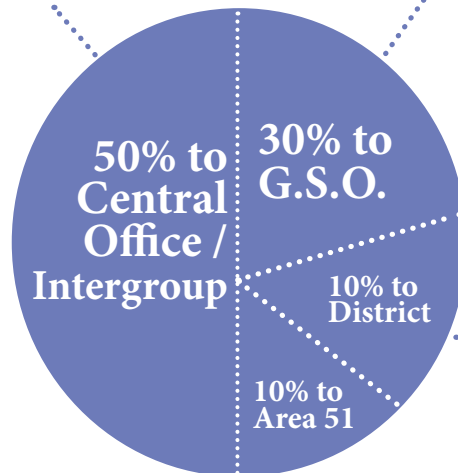

Corrections Corner

(Prayers, poems, stories from behind the walls)

“Who Me?”

It is almost 3 years ago that I attended my first Freedom from Bondage Workshop. As a newly elected district corrections chairperson, I thought that I better get busy and learn about what AA does for inmates in jails and prisons. For about a year I had been going with other volunteers who were bringing AA meetings into the jails. I had never been arrested (caught) or spent any time incarcerated (yet).

The first time that I attended the workshop I experienced a spiritual awakening that was to change my life forever. I saw AAs demonstrating their commitment to carrying the message of HOPE to our incarcerated sisters and brothers. I can only speak for myself but the level of commitment was such that I had never experienced. I met men and women who had gotten sober in the prisons of North Carolina by the grace of God and Alcoholics Anonymous who are now “paying it forward.”

I knew at that moment that my Higher Power wanted me to serve by becoming involved with AA’s singleness of purpose by carrying the message of recovery from alcoholism to the men and women who are so easily forgotten. I, along with others, have the honor and privilege to be allowed into the prisons to support ongoing meetings.

When I attend the regular Saturday night meeting at Craggy men’s medium correctional facility, I get to witness the changes that occur in the members. I have experienced the Presence of God in the meetings. I get to see the innate goodness in those members and I always hear the Language of the Heart.

The group has become stronger and has registered with GSO. The Corrections Desk at the General Service Office has provided information needed for these members to participate in the broader structure of AA. They have elected an “advocate” whose responsibility is to bring their votes and concerns to the District meetings and Area Assemblies.

The inmates receive the Mountain Doin’s which has created a section called the “Corrections Corner.” One of their members submitted a

prayer. At the group’s request he stood up in front of all of the members and read it to them. Every single person applauded him. I was consumed with gratitude.

At this time there are about 8 male volunteers and one female volunteer who attend meetings held at Craggy. As AA volunteers we are treated with respect and gratitude for supporting the meetings. Without Alcoholics Anonymous and a God of our own understanding, none of this would be possible.

A Call for Stories

In response to 2015 General Service Conference Advisory Actions the trustees’ Literature committee is requesting stories for revision of the following pamphlets:

- **“A.A. for the Woman”** — revision to include current sharing from women in A.A., including “stories from women in the military, single mothers, and women of diverse backgrounds.”
- **“A.A. and the Gay/Lesbian Alcoholic”** — seeking stories from A.A. members who are gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender or gender nonconforming, especially regarding being a newcomer and sponsorship.

Another Advisory Action requests that the trustees’ Literature Committee develop literature for “alcoholics with mental health issues.” For this project the committee is requesting a wide range of A.A. recovery experience from members with mental health issues, and from those who sponsor such members.

In all three undertakings, the trustees are giving special consideration to sharing from disabled veterans and from nonbelievers.

The anonymity of all authors will be observed, whether or not their story is selected for publication. *Please email your sharing to: Literature@aa.org and put the name of the pamphlet or topic you are addressing in the subject line of the message. Or, you may mail it to Literature Coordinator, General Service Office, Box 459, Grand Central Station, New York, NY 10163. The deadline for submissions is October 15, 2015.*

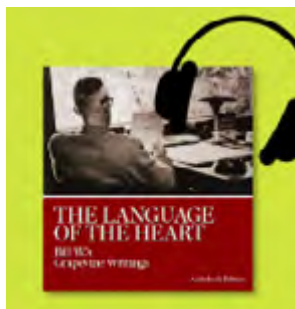


