### **Letter from Central Office**

The North Carolina Mountain Central Office wants to thank everyone who attended, volunteered and participated in the District 70 Service Rally on July 9th. It was a joy to see so many people gathered, from those curious about AA and the service opportunities it offers, to the die-hard dedicated volunteers who make sure the hand of AA is there, whenever someone reaches out. If you missed the morning Central Office Workshop, you missed the opportunity to hear from Rachel, our Area 51 representative. Rachel not only shared her experience, strength and hope with us, she also described how she came to discover, through various channels, how to be of service to her group and AA as a whole. She explained the history of AA, how it began to form the structure in order to carry the three legacies of Recovery, Unity and Service beyond their humble beginnings into what we see today. As the true teacher she is, she demonstrated clearly how the groups are the most important part of the structure of the conference (as seen in the upside down triangle) and how all the parts work together to uphold the 12 Traditions and 12 Concepts to keep AA functioning through these changing times.

Following Rachel's presentation, Dawn from Central Office described her humble beginnings as a Central Office volunteer, eventually leading to service on the board of directors. While Central Office has a vast array of literature on AA recovery, some of which were raffled off during the presentation, the purpose of Central Office is to serve the local AA community –by updating and publishing the Where & When schedule of meetings throughout the three districts we serve in Western North Carolina (Districts 70, 71 and 80). The Central Office is also charged with maintaining the 12 step call list and answering service, so that crisis calls will be answered and referred to one of the volunteers willing to share their experience, strength and hope with a suffering alcoholic. This is where some of the service opportunities exist within Central Office – as well as service to your group as the Central Office Representative (COR) who attends and votes on Central Office business at quarterly meetings. Our website keeps the AA information seeker connected and informed. Our monthly newsletter, the Mountain Doin's, helps announce events, special meetings and service opportunities, and posts Central Office business and financial stats. We proudly display anniversaries for groups that send in their monthly updates, and encourage submissions of stories, letters or testimonials (and don't forget the flyers for the group events). To wrap it up, the current board members introduced themselves and made themselves available during the day for questions.

We at Central Office are grateful to District 70 for allowing us to open and present at their annual service rally. We enjoyed the interesting speakers, the abundant food and the introduction to the service chairs and special guests from corrections, treatment and liaisons to the professional community (CPC/PI). If you missed the information sessions and mingling with the service volunteers, you can still reach out to the district for information on service opportunities that you might find interesting and fulfilling. (U.S. and Canada)

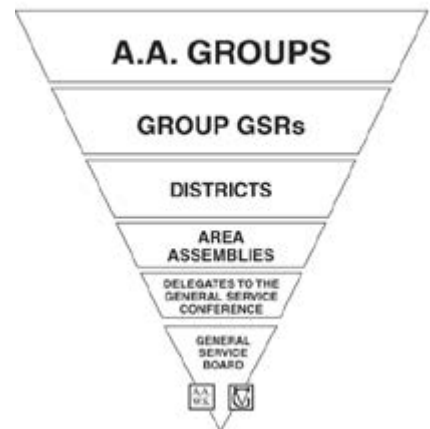

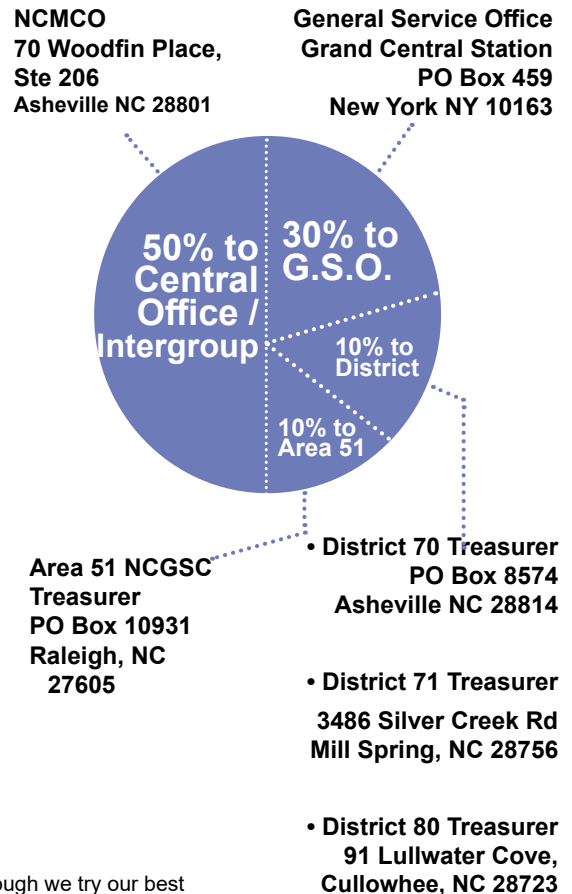
