12-Step Call Volunteers Needed in Western North Carolina

"I am responsible. When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of A.A. always to be there. And for that: I am responsible." —©The A.A. Grapevine, Inc.*

Our North Carolina Mountain Central Office (NCMCO) in Asheville has an AA member who is the Coordinator for the "12-Step Call List" – covering most of Western NC. That list consists of AA members who volunteer to be phoned when an alcoholic reaches out for help.

When a call for help is received at Central Office – or at the after-hours answering service (hotline) – an AA 12-Step volunteer is called and given the phone number of the person asking for help – AA members' phone numbers are not given out. We are especially in need of Spanish-speaking volunteers as well as volunteers in some of the more remote areas – all of the District 80 counties (Cherokee, Graham, Swain, Haywood, Clay, Macon and Jackson) and the District 70 counties of Yancey, Mitchell and Madison. We don't get a lot of 12-Step calls but when we do it sure does help to have volunteers from these areas who we can call to connect to that alcoholic who is reaching for help.

"Practical experience shows that nothing will so much insure immunity from drinking as intensive work with other alcoholics. It works when other activities fail....Carry this message to other alcoholics! You can help when no one else can. You can secure their confidence when others fail." —Alcoholics Anonymous, p. 89*

"Practically every A.A. member declares that no satisfaction has been deeper and no joy greater than in a Twelfth Step job well done. To watch the eyes of men and women open with wonder as they move from darkness into light, to see their lives quickly fill with new purpose and meaning, to see whole families reassembled, to see the alcoholic outcast received back into his community in full citizenship, and above all to watch these people awaken to the presence of a loving God in their lives—these things are the substance of what we receive as we carry A.A.'s message to the next alcoholic." —Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, pg 110*

It is suggested that AA members who would like to be on the 12-Step Call Volunteer list have at least 1 year of sobriety, belong to a home group and have a sponsor. 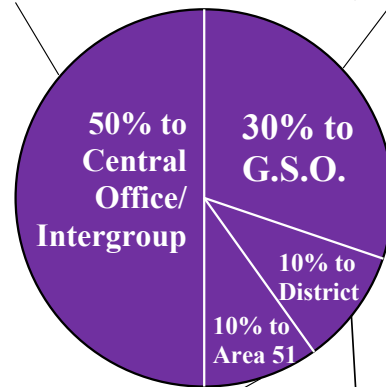

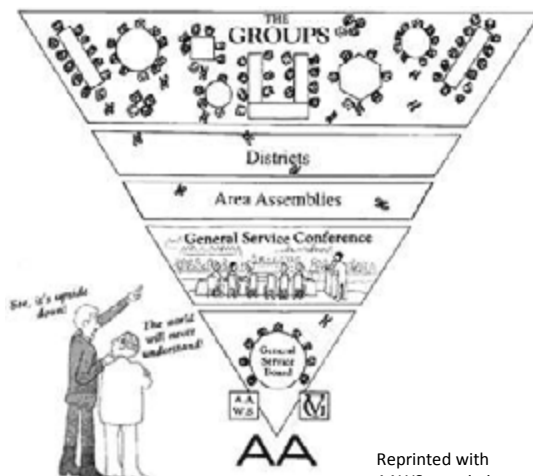

From the Western Mountains: Take I-40 East to exit 123 (321 South). Follow the ramp by staying right and proceed on 321 South to Exit 24 (Highway 150/27 (Lincolnton). Turn Left off ramp, stay right and follow 27 out of town and make a left on 73 East. Follow 73 East past the Nuclear Power plant and turn Right on Beatties Ford Road. Follow Beatties Ford Road until you reach Hopewell Presbyterian on the left. Enter the church from the 2nd parking lot.

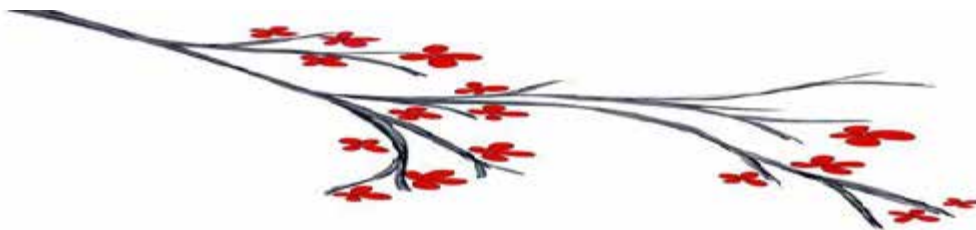
