given the phone number of the person asking for help. (AA members' phone numbers are not given out.) It is suggested that AA members who would like to be on the 12-Step Call Volunteer list have at least 1 year of sobriety, belong to a home group and have a sponsor.

Lately, we – the office, the answering service and after-hours hotline volunteers – are finding it very difficult reaching the volunteers who are on our current 12-Step Call Volunteer List. Sometimes it takes a dozen calls before we get someone who answers their phone, even people who have indicated they are available “24/7”. We have resorted to leaving messages for the 12-Step volunteers in the hope that they will call us back since we know it is not always possible to answer the phone if they are on another call or, in the case of a cellphone, driving. Sometimes it's been months or even years since you signed up to be on the list and have yet to receive a call. Often that is due to geography as we have been trying to pair callers to volunteers in the same locale. We don't get a lot of 12-Step calls but when we do, it sure does help to have volunteers from ALL areas whom we can call to connect to that alcoholic who is reaching out for help.

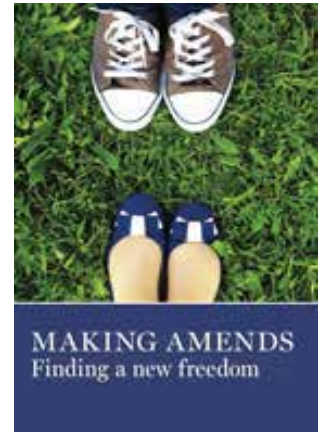

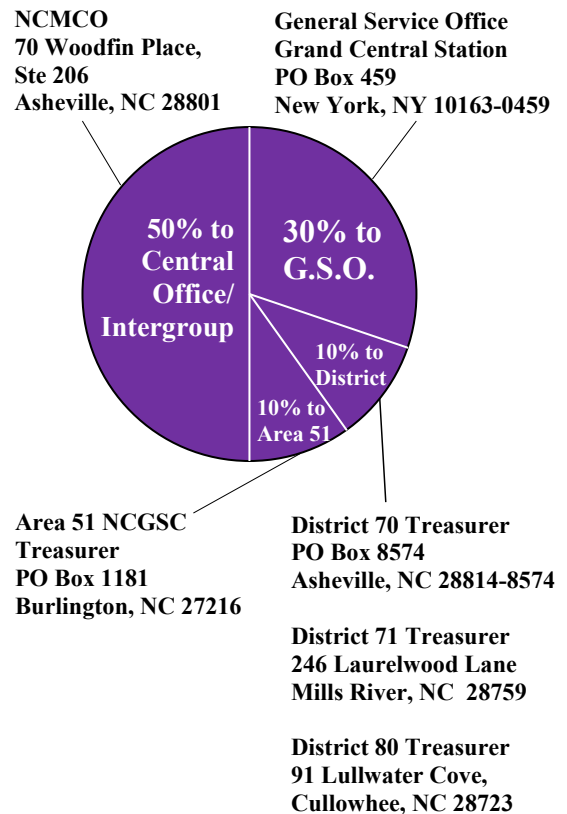

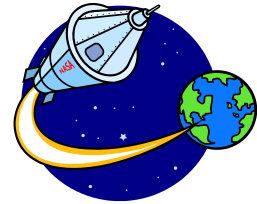
