Small, But Mighty: Leicester Group Celebrates 32 Years

In January, The Leicester Group celebrated its 32nd anniversary. The group has a closed Big Book discussion meeting every Wednesday night at 7 p.m. at Bell Methodist Church on Leicester Highway, just 8 miles from Patton Avenue.

Many AAs have attended the Leicester Group over its long history. A small core of home group members has always warmly welcomed newcomers and old-timers alike, which led to the group's unofficial motto, "Small, But Mighty," a saying of Gene M., one of the group's founders. Many other early members, many of them from Madison County AA groups, were instrumental in helping start the Leicester Group. The early members were: Ken A., Gene M., Malcolm O., Grady O., Walter S., Tracy T., MV and Lucille C., Harold F., Roy H., Ray B., Nelson A., Ruby G., Anne F., Gretchen J., Sharon W., Wayne W., and David H. As the group's written history states, "Without their help, there would be no meeting here tonight for us to attend."

The Leicester Group is fortunate because its group history was recorded in a unique and lasting way which was passed down from the earliest members. Beginning in 1986, important group information was written in the group copy of the Big Book, on the inside covers and first and last blank pages. Members also signed their names and listed their sobriety date in this Big Book, making these pages a handwritten archive of AA's 32-year history in the Leicester area. The group has also preserved its history by archiving the minutes from its monthly business meetings.

The group's very first meeting was held on January 22, 1986 at the Leicester Community Center and was chaired by Tracey T. The group continued to meet at the Community Center on Wednesdays at 8 p.m. for the next 19 years. In 2005, the group moved to nearby Bell Methodist Church.

Three years later, the group began a second weekly meeting, on Saturday nights. The Saturday meeting ran for more than nine years, from November 1, 2008 through February 24, 2018.

In the early days of the group, it was customary to give a silver dollar to group members on their personal AA anniversaries, with a new hole drilled into the same silver dollar for each year of sobriety. As the group grew, and the sober years and decades accumulated, each member's silver dollar had less and less room remaining for new holes to be drilled (a good thing!) so eventually the group switched to presenting standard AA medallions on group members' birthdays.

In early 1986, when the group was first getting started, there might be only one or two people attending the meeting. Gene M. recalled that he and Ken A. would open the building, but would wait before turning on the heat or making the coffee, in case no one else showed up. To solve the problem of potential AAs having trouble finding the meeting, which was in a building set back from the road, a large handmade sign was donated to the group by Malcolm O. The sign was placed at the driveway entrance and featured the letters "AA" which were three-feet tall, hand-cut from plywood, and painted white so they could easily be seen by cars passing by on Leicester Highway.



So I'm telling myself again that this is my last time. And now I know what steps to take to make that my reality.




