## Area 51 Western North Carolina Pre-Conference

We, the WNC Pre-Conference Co-Chairs from Districts 70 and 71, started planning for the Pre-Conference last year when Area 51 accepted our plan to hold the event in Hendersonville. With District 80 joining Districts 70 and 71, we had broad participation, fellowship and cooperation in planning this event.

Having set the date of April 7, 2018 while we were at the Summer 2017 Area Committee Meeting, we immediately searched for a venue that would fit our plan. We needed a place that could accommodate 150 people, had 6 breakout rooms, adequate parking and a working kitchen. Within a week we decided upon the First Baptist Church of Hendersonville. We could not have asked for a more perfect setting. The church has a food service supervisor who agreed to cater the meal. A.A. dessert brigades were ready with a sumptuous dessert table.

We had volunteers at every level -- greeters, parking reps, shoppers, registration attendants, sign hangers, and other folks who signed up to help wherever they were needed. It was teamwork at its best.

The Pre-Conference discussions took place immediately following lunch. The Area 51 Delegate, Kenneth C.; Alternate Delegate, Katy; Area 51 Treatment Chair, Greg K.; and U.S. Trustee-at-large, Newton P., were essential in supporting us and also in conducting the conference.

The Western Region of North Carolina consists of 13 Districts. 12 were represented at the event. Approximately 120 A.A.s attended. Many were first year G.S.R.s (General Service Representatives) and D.C.M.s (District Committee Members). There were a few G.S.R.s who had been very recently elected by their groups. There were also regular group members who were interested in service. There was a spirit of fellowship and sharing as we met other folks from the Region. It was truly an opportunity for our voices to be heard, to speak up about various agenda topics that will be discussed at the General Service Conference in New York City, April 22-28, and to witness Alcoholics Anonymous at work.

## Bridging the Gap

*A member shares a brief history of our wonderful, lifesaving local AA service.*

Terry L. is a past delegate (panel 63) from Southern Minnesota who has been involved with Bridging the Gap Twelfth Step work since the late 1980s. In 1991, he helped start the first Bridging the Gap Workshop Weekend with Rod B., a past delegate from Des Moines, Iowa. It is now an annual service event. The following article is Terry's brief history of the Bridging the Gap program.

Bridging The Gap, or BTG, is the name and description of our AA Twelfth Step work that's specifically focused on helping new prospects coming out of correctional facilities or treatment centers.

Efforts by AAs to connect alcoholics in facilities to our program go back as far as 1939, long before Bridging the Gap became a name for this kind of service. In Cleveland, Ohio after articles (*continued inside*)

(continued from front cover) were published in the Plain Dealer, there was a massive effort by AAs to reach drunks in the hospitals. They didn't have enough older members, so brand new AAs were sent in to escort the new prospect to AA meetings, and it was discovered they could do as good a job as the old-timers. This activity helped form the beginnings in early AA of personal sponsorship for each new man and woman.

In the mid 1970s, with the rapid growth of formal alcoholism treatment programs, it became clear that there was a need for programs to connect alcoholics to AA. Many alcoholics were leaving treatment programs and not making it to AA (and usually not staying sober). A number of AA members began to do Twelfth Step work to try to improve this situation.

In 1976, an After Care Temporary Sponsor (ACTS) program began in Alberta, Canada, to provide temporary sponsors for alcoholics being released from prisons. In 1978, Dr. Jack Norris served as a Class A trustee and worked in the alcoholism field. In October of that year, he wrote a report entitled "Bridging the Gap Between Active Treatment and AA and Normal Living." This was the first I could find of the term "Bridging the Gap." Based on early articles, it appears that some of the first Bridging the Gap service started near institutions in Canada and in treatment facilities in Oklahoma.

In 1987, a section describing "Temporary Contact Programs" was added to the AA Treatment Committee Workbook. This workbook – which can be found on [www.aa.org](http://www.aa.org) – is a collection of information written by AA members and GSO staff, reviewed and approved by the General Service Conference. It is designed to help AA members working on service committees who are focused on how AA can help alcoholics coming out of treatment programs.

The 1991 General Service Conference approved a pamphlet called "Bridging the Gap – Between Treatment and A.A. Through temporary Contact Programs." The pamphlet not only helped to increase awareness of BTG service within the Fellowship, but also helped to clarify the role and the need for temporary contacts.

Today many areas have organized Bridging the Gap programs. There is also an annual BTG workshop, called Bridging the Gap Workshop Weekend (BTGWW), where AAs involved with local BTG programs across the U.S. and Canada come together to share their successes and challenges. The 27th annual workshop was held in Minneapolis this past September. Their website, [www.btgww.org](http://www.btgww.org), enables any AA member to request a contact for a prospect anywhere in the U.S. and Canada. The website also provides information about the next annual Workshop Weekend and

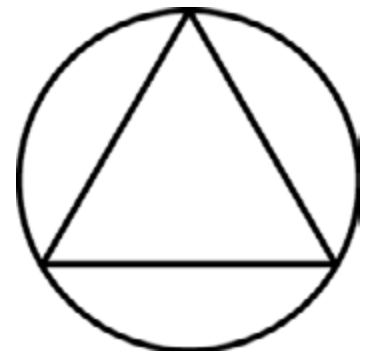
