Central Office Positions Open

The Central Office Board has two positions that need filling: 12-Step Call Volunteer Coordinator (After working hard to update the 12-Step Call Volunteer list, Hope, the previous Coordinator, moved to Florida in January) and Mountain Doin's Editor (Sarah, our current newsletter editor, has been doing a great job for 4 years! In the spirit of rotation, she is willing to step aside if there is someone else who would like the position.)

12-Step Call Volunteer Coordinator:

- Has responsibility for maintaining the 12-Step Call Volunteer list, with help from the Office Manager.
- Recruits new volunteers.
- Interacts with Office Manager to provide the Office, Answering Service and After-hours Hotline Volunteers with updates to the 12-Step Call Volunteer list. Shares responsibility with NCMCO to ensure appropriate rotation of calls to 12-Step volunteers.
- Attends Board meetings as a voting member.

Mountain Doin's Editor:

- Has overall responsibility for the monthly Mountain Doin's newsletter and may be paid a reasonable amount established by the Board for this service.
- Most of the work of gathering materials for the newsletter is done by the Office Manager. Editor is responsible for design format and for putting the actual newsletter together. Design experience and computer skills are needed.
- Attends Board meetings as a voting member.

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After-hours Hotline Volunteers Urgently Needed!

As of June, the answering service we have been using for 5 years to handle after-hours calls is ceasing operation. And right now, we only have one very dedicated Hotline Volunteer (and a new one as of May 16!) to whom we can transfer calls after hours. We are urgently seeking more volunteers for this service. At the same time, we are speedily working to engage another local answering service we can use when volunteers are not available.

Here's how it works:

At present the Central Office manager forwards the phone after hours to an auto-attendant system. Office hours are Monday-Friday, 10am-1pm. When someone calls after hours, they get a recording instructing them to press "0" if they wish to speak with someone or "1" if they want to leave a message for the Office. (If you have not yet heard the after-hours recording, we encourage you to call in after hours and listen to the message.)

Within the auto-attendant system, the phone number that callers will be transferred to when they press "0" can be set to the Hotline Volunteer's number. Since the phone number that shows up on caller ID when calls are transferred is the number of the caller – not the Central Office number – the Hotline Volunteer should be prepared to answer all calls during that time period, or at least any number they don't recognize, by saying, "Alcoholics Anonymous. How can I help you?"

Each After-hours Hotline Volunteer is given a note book with the list of 12-Step Call Volunteers and (Continued Inside)



area resources. When someone calls in after hours wanting to speak with someone, the Hotline Volunteer uses their judgment as to whether to talk to the caller herself/himself. Or they can take down the caller's name and phone number and tell the person they will have someone call them shortly. Then they would go through the 12-Step Call List to find a volunteer of the same gender to call the person, ideally someone in the caller's area. Often the caller is just in need of meeting information, so it is important for Hotline Volunteers to have an updated Where & When meeting schedule, which Central Office provides, and if possible, Internet access for meeting information on the website www.aancmco.org.

One of the issues that may have discouraged A.A. members from volunteering for this service is the need to cover after-hours calls from the time the office closes at 1:00pm until 10:00am the following morning. Not everyone who would like to volunteer is available that length of time. By accessing the auto-attendant system remotely, we are able to divide the after-hours coverage into shorter time periods to better accommodate volunteers' schedules. We don't get a lot of calls after hours; some nights none, other nights maybe 3 or 4. But it is critical that we have someone answering the call, whether it's for meeting information or a 12-Step Call, whenever it comes in – day or night.




