Central Office Positions Open

Office Manager

Pam, the current Office Manager, is planning to retire in 2020 so the Board will be accepting applications (cover letters with resumes) from the first of January through the end of February. Once a new Office Manager has been selected there will be a two-week period of overlap to facilitate a seamless transition. The Office Manager is a paid position – 20 hours a week at \$15.00/hour. Prospective employees must meet the by-laws qualifications and be computer literate. Experience with QuickBooks is preferred. Responsibilities include, but are not necessarily limited to:

- Ensuring appropriate day-to-day operation of the office.
- Determining hours of operation, in consultation with the Central Office Board.
- Creating and maintaining appropriate volunteer lists.
- Preparing and distributing mailings, newsletters, schedules, and other printed material.
- Day-to-day management of all office functions, including financial affairs, inventory control, and other duties.
- Shall provide timely written notice of the meetings of the Committees.
- Shall see that reports, statements and other documents required by law are properly kept and filed, as well as books, records and papers of the North Carolina Central Office archives.
- Attends Board and General Committee meetings as a voting member.

- Performs other duties as specified by the Central Office Board or approved job description.
- Shall have at least five years of continuous sobriety.

Chairperson – a two-year term starting January 2020

- Shall preside at Central Office Board and COR General Committee meetings.
- Shall see that all decisions of the Committees are acted upon.
- Pursuant to specific authority given on occasion by the Committees, may sign and deliver contracts and other documents in the name of North Carolina Mountain Central Office Inc.
- With the recommendation and approval of the Central Office Board, shall call for eligible people to stand for positions and appoint chairpersons of standing and special subcommittees.
- May vote, bring motions, initiate and engage in discussion and debate at board meetings in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order for Small Groups (see "How Meetings Operate" at end of the bylaws).
- Shall perform all duties incident to the office of Chairman and other duties that may occasionally be assigned by the Committees.
- Shall have five years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office.

Secretary – a two-year term starting January 2020

- Shall perform all duties incident to the office and others as assigned.
- Shall attend and take minutes of all COR General Committee and Central Office Board meetings and have copies available at the Central Office's customary place of business within 14 days after the meeting.
- Shall follow the Alternate Chair in line of succession to the Chair at board meetings.
- Shall have at least five years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office.

Mountain Doin's Editor:

- Has overall responsibility for the monthly Mountain Doin's newsletter. (Note: Most of the work gathering materials for the newsletter is done by the Office Manager; the editor puts it into the design format. Computer skills required; software expenses will be reimbursed.)
- Attends Board meetings as a voting member.
- Shall have at least three years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office. Term of position is for 3 years.

Webmaster

- Has responsibility for publishing and maintaining the Central Office website www.aancmco.org in accordance with Central Office policies. (Note: Any expenses for software will be reimbursed.)
- Attends Board meetings as a voting member.
- Shall have at least three years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office. Term of position is for 3 years.

Trustee

New Trustees are needed for Districts 70 and 71. (District 80 selected a new Trustee in November. Welcome Keith!) As specified in the Central Office Bylaws, ideally one District Trustee shall be elected by its respective district in each year of a three-year period. Three-year terms may be flexible based on the needs of each district. If you are interested in being the Trustee from your district, attend your respective General Service District meeting. Here are the responsibilities of the Trustee:

- Shall provide general guidance of the overall operations of Central Office.
- Shall make recommendations to the CORs and the Central Office Board for improvements or changes.
- Shall be someone with long-term sobriety, with knowledgeable experience of A.A. Steps, Traditions, and Concepts, and has long-term


involvement and commitment to A.A. service work.


