Alternate Chairperson

- Shall perform the duties of the Chairman when requested by the Chairman or in the case of his absence or inability to act, and shall preferably be interested in rotating to the Chairperson position if it becomes vacant.
- Shall perform other duties as occasionally assigned.
- Shall have at least five years continuous sobriety at the time of taking office
- Shall attend Central Office Board and General Committee meetings.

Secretary

- Shall perform all duties incident to the office and others as assigned.
- Shall attend and take minutes of all COR General Committee and Central Office Board meetings and have copies available at the Central Office's customary place of business within 14 days after the day meeting.
- Shall follow the Alternate Chair in line of succession to the Chair at board meetings.
- Shall have at least five years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office.

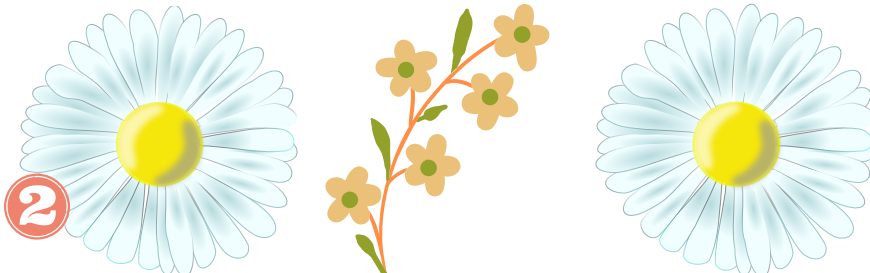

For many years, A.A. members have celebrated their sobriety by sending a contribution to the General Service Office. 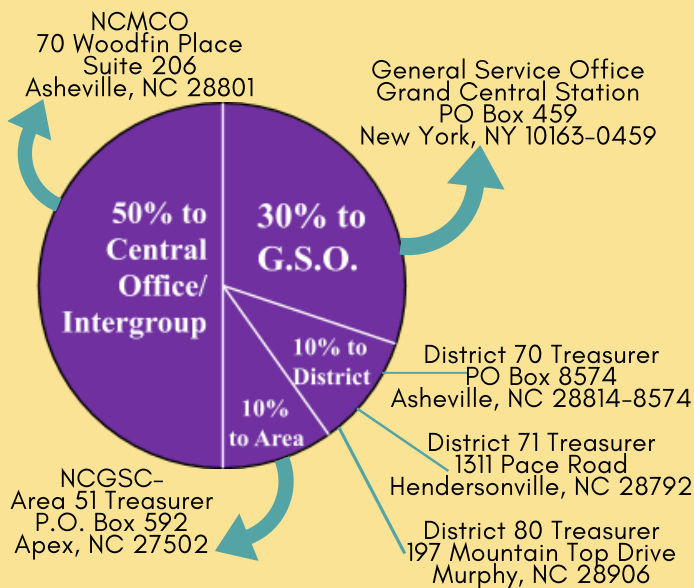
