Alternate Chairperson

Shall perform the duties of the Chairman when requested by the Chairman or in the case of his absence or inability to act, and shall preferably be interested in rotating to the Chairperson position if it becomes vacant.

Shall perform other duties as occasionally assigned. Shall have at least five years continuous sobriety at the time of taking office.

Shall attend Central Office Board and General Committee meetings.

Secretary

Shall perform all duties incident to the office and others as assigned.

Shall attend and take minutes of all COR General Committee and Central Office Board meetings and have copies available at the Central Office's customary place of business within 14 days after the day meeting. Shall follow the Alternate Chair in line of succession to the Chair at board meetings.

Shall have at least five years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office.

12-Step Call Volunteer Coordinator

Has responsibility for maintaining the 12-Step Call Volunteer list, with help from the Office Manager.

Recruits new volunteers.

Interacts with Office Manager to provide the Office, Answering Service and After-hours Hotline Volunteers with updates to the 12-Step Call Volunteer list.

Shares responsibility with NCMCO to ensure appropriate rotation of calls to 12-Step volunteers.

Attends Board meetings as a voting member.

Shall have at least three years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office. Term of position is for 3 years.

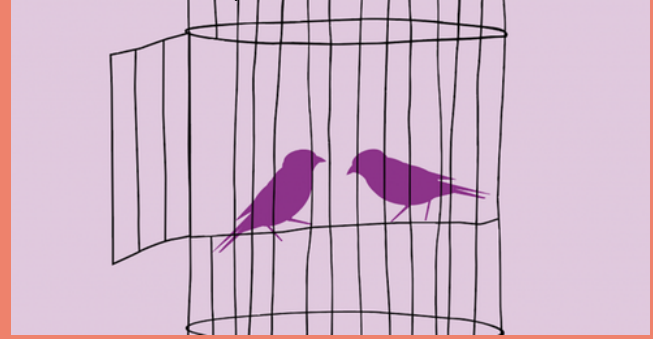

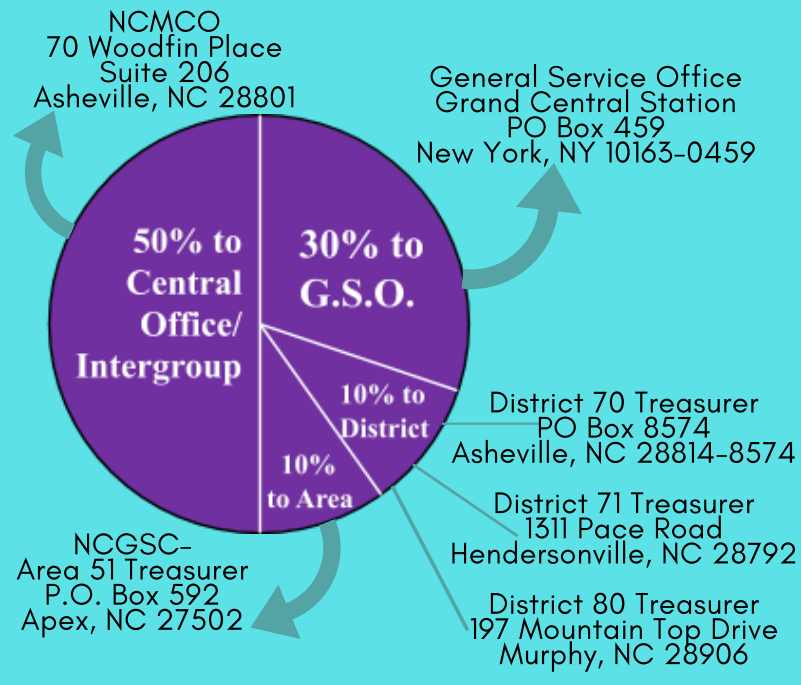
Spanish Speakers Needed!

What We Do at NC Mountain Central Office

Answer inquiries about Alcoholics Anonymous and meetings in WNC. When calls come in from individuals looking for help, staff & volunteers contact AA members on the 12-step volunteer list which is maintained by the 12-Step Call Volunteer Coordinator. The 12-step volunteer is given the name & phone number of the caller seeking help. (Names & numbers of AA members/volunteers are never given out.) Individuals seeking help for problems other than alcohol are referred to the appropriate programs or agencies.

Coordinate with the After-hours Hotline Volunteers and the answering service to handle calls after hours; provide the volunteers and answering service with updated meeting information and list of 12-step volunteers.

Regularly update the meeting schedule, Where & When, and coordinate meeting information with the webmasters for Districts 70, 71 & 80. Periodically check meeting information on websites maintained by the districts, following up on anything that is different from what we have listed.

Keep inventory of literature, chips and medallions to sell to groups and individuals - often packing and mailing items to those who can't get into the office during the hours we are open - 10am-1pm, Mon. through Fri. - or leaving items outside the office for after-hours pickup.

Publish a monthly newsletter, Mountain Doin's, to keep the AA community apprised of events and special articles of interest. Normally one printed copy is mailed free to each group but the print version has been temporarily suspended. The newsletter is posted on our website and we email a link to over 500 addresses.

Work with the various District Committees (Treatment, Corrections, CPC/PI, Archives) and those in the community seeking information about AA.

Spread the word about local and national AA events, conventions and workshops and act as a clearinghouse for information and logistical support between individual AA members, groups, local and state committees, General Service Office in New York, and the community at large. Store District 70 Archives.

Hold bimonthly meetings (on the odd-numbered months) of the Board and CORs (Central Office Representatives) to discuss Central Office business and provide a forum for suggestions and concerns. The meetings are open to all and we welcome new ideas and input.
