  - Electronic: Converted to Adobe PDF; uploaded to the website with the link e-mailed by Office Manager to each subscriber requesting electronic service, at no charge

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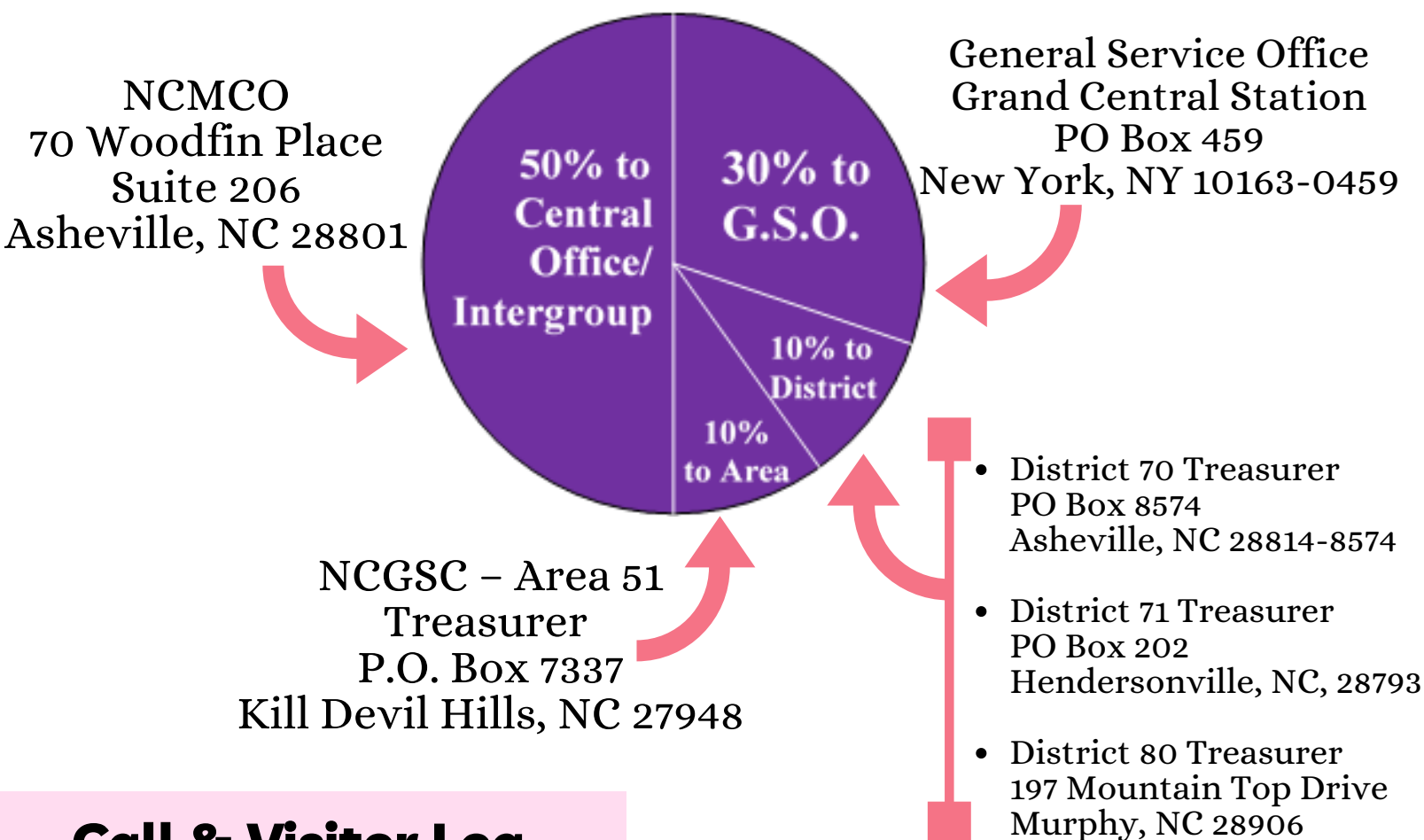
### Treasurer (2-year term; beginning January 2021):
