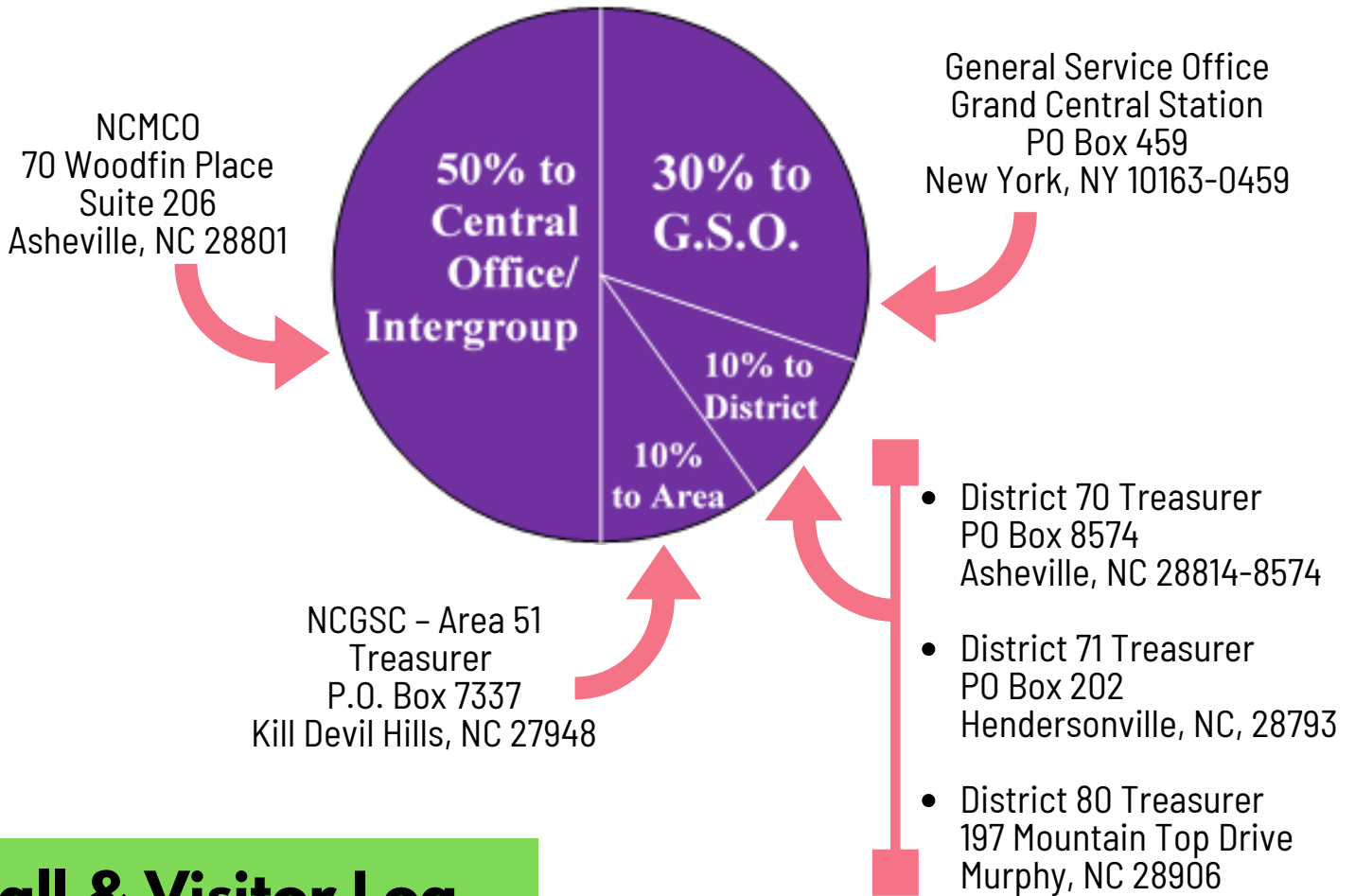
### Treasurer (2-year term; beginning January 2021 – Angie, our current Treasurer, has agreed to stay on until we find another volunteer.)

For many years, A.A. members have celebrated their sobriety by sending a contribution to the General Service Office.
