Newsletter Editor (Filling the remainder of a 3-year term that began March 2020)

- Has overall responsibility for the monthly Mountain Doin's newsletter. (See below regarding purpose, content and distribution.) The editor may be reimbursed for publishing expenses.
- Attends Board and General Committee meetings as a voting member.
- Shall have at least three years of continuous sobriety.
- The suggested term will be three years.

Purpose:

- Inform the Groups and members of information and events in all Districts in the service area of the Central Office.
- Provide interesting and thought-provoking articles pertaining to the fellowship and the program of Alcoholics Anonymous.
- Provide a platform for members to express their ideas and opinions.
- Inform Groups and members of Central Office events and other information that benefits them.

Content:

- Monthly Central Office Financial Report
- Anniversaries submitted by groups
- Group contributions
- Calendar of Group/District functions or Activities for the month and coming months
- District information to be used at each District's discretion
- Contributions by individual members, Groups, and Districts including: articles, humor, upcoming events, reports of past events, any information thought important
- Adheres to Central Office Policy on Anonymity.

Distribution:

- Print (temporarily suspended during pandemic)
- Electronic: Converted to Adobe PDF; uploaded to the website with the link e-mailed by Office Manager to each subscriber requesting electronic service, at no charge.

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Treasurer (2-year term, which began January 2021; Angie, our current Treasurer, has agreed to stay on until we find another volunteer.)

- Having charge and custody of all funds of Central Office.
- Accuracy of all financial records of Central Office.
- Receipts and disbursements as approved by the Central Office's various committees.
- Arranges for preparation and filing of all required tax returns.
- Prepares an annual financial report.
- Prepares monthly financial report and presents it to the Central Office Board and COR General Committee.
- Attends Central Office Board and General Committee meetings.
- Shall have at least five years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office.

Secretary (Filling the remainder of a 2-year term that began January 2020, with the possibility of continuing for another 2-year term starting January 2022)

- Shall perform all duties incident to the office and others as assigned.
- Shall attend and take minutes of all COR General Committee and Central Office Board meetings and have copies available at the Central Office's customary place of business within 14 days after the meeting.
- Shall follow the Alternate Chair in line of succession to the Chair at board meetings.
- Shall have at least five years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office.


