Do we sometimes put too much importance on the amount of sober time we have?


I got sober when I was 18; I'm now about to turn 39. I find myself cringing when someone asks me how long I've been sober, or when we share our sober dates in a meeting. The reason is because I know what's usually coming: "Oh, wow! that's amazing. Did you get sober when you were 12?" Or sometimes I get, "Man, I wish I were as smart as you at that age."

I actually don't know how to respond to these comments. They leave me feeling apart from the others. It sometimes scares me. AA is the only place I truly feel connected to people. Without AA, I can't even image where my life would be.

I realize that the members who react in regret are speaking from their own experiences; it has nothing to do with me. I have stopped owning the feeling that I've done something wrong. I must say sometimes it's still a little difficult. When it happens, I do my best to just gather up all the love and energy of the program that I have and send it back to them.

For the people who think that I was smarter than they were at 18, I say this: I was restless, irritable and discontent even before I picked up a drink. Those feelings were the first memories I can remember. Even though I didn't drink for very long I had been in an alcoholic hell for many years. Just like other AA members, I finally got in enough pain to do something and make a real change. Maybe my threshold for pain was just lower than theirs? I don't know.

It says in the "Twelve and Twelve" in the chapter on Step Three, "So it is by

circumstance rather than by any virtue that we have been driven to AA." I can sure relate to that. I too was driven to AA, just as everyone else. Trust me when I tell you, there was no virtue involved!


So if there's any message here, it's this: Please don't "rate" people's stories or sobriety. If someone's story is different than yours regarding time, place, people, that's OK. It doesn't mean that one person is any better or smarter at this. In the end, whatever we were doing in our earlier life, we all ended up in these rooms because we were sick.

Tradition Five says, "...to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers." That's any alcoholic, not just newcomers. The longtimers, although sober, can still be suffering too. I had always envisioned that our longtimers would lead and I would follow, but sometimes they need someone to follow and it doesn't matter how many years someone has. If you're practicing the Steps and are in good spiritual condition, you can be the lead for a while. We all share that privilege and responsibility. There have been times I've been in spiritual, emotional or mental pain and listening to someone who has just a few months of sobriety can help me.

So I say, forget the number of years sober. The number belongs to AA, to show that the program works. But where we are today and what we do with those hours is our responsibility.





North/South Special Forum about Remote Communities

We invite you to join with us as we stretch the virtual hand of A.A. from Canada and the United States to the furthest reaches of South America, on Saturday July 16, 2022, from 11:00am to 7:00-pm EDT.

Our Special Forum on July 16, co-ordinated by the US/Canada General Service Office, builds on the success of the first North/South Forum held in May 15 of 2021. Three AA service structures and four countries are involved in the planning, and we welcome our friends to the south, Argentina and Chile, as partners in the project. Members of the Fellowship in each of those countries face many of the same challenges as are faced in remote areas and communities of North America in terms of connecting to other A.A. members, other groups, their Areas and A.A. as a whole. This Special Forum opens the definition of "remote" to include the challenges of not just geography (which was the focus of the May event), but also of language and of culture.

The main objective is to bring members throughout our home "zone" together for direct sharing of experience, strength and hope.

There will be three, two-hour sessions, with topics being considered including "AA's Language of the Heart", "Hidden Communities: How Do We Find Them", and "Strengthening our Structure Through Connections". There will be Q & A sessions after every panel, as well as videos from all four of the participating partner countries. English, French and Spanish interpretation will be available.

As the topics are being developed, and the program is confirmed, we will be "speaker-seeking" throughout the US and Canada. We are also pleased that there will be broad opportunity to attend the event on July 16. We encourage everyone who can, to attend!
