Who would have guessed she'd find a home group she loves in a former beach town bar?

Very early, three mornings a week, I hop on my bike and ride to the building that houses my home group. It's a short ride through the streets of this old California beach city. The fresh air and experience that my fellow alcoholics share there bring energy to my legs and lungs as I ride.

Turning the corner to the back patio, where I lock up my bike, I see familiar people mingling before the meeting. Walking into the building—a former bar that's now a fellowship club—I feel at peace.

The interior of the building dates from the 1970s, with many AA sayings and slogans and Steps and Traditions on the wood-covered walls. We have a coffee bar at the back entrance, where the former bar used to be. I can hear the warm chatter of friendly voices in the room as the people file in and find their seats.

A birthday board hangs on the wall behind the front desk where our members can write their upcoming sobriety anniversaries to be celebrated that month. On the desk where the leader sits is an oversized gavel, which is more of a prop than a tool used to bring members in line. People take turns leading the meetings—we do not govern—and there is a wonderful sense of humor in the room.

After several years of attending this group parttime, I was invited by one of the oldtimers to join them in a golf tournament they were holding. That's when I really felt a part of and no longer a visitor.

In time, as my children grew up and left home, I found myself thinking of it as my home group. My dear friend who goes on walks before the meeting gets there early and saves me a seat. I see her walking early when I'm running before the meeting. We greet each other in the dark with a big hug and say, "I'll see you there!" I get a burst of energy with her warm embrace.



This group has helped me by listening to me share as l've weathered the ups and downs of life's journey. And I have listened and learned from their sharing as well. We all stay sober together. When someone is in the hospital, we go visit them. At Thanksgiving, Christmas and other major drinking holidays, we have marathon meetings and potlucks so those of us who'd rather be with our AA family have somewhere to go. Last year, I went to one of those marathon meetings when I was adjusting to the fact that my oldest son was spending Christmas in jail.

I've had the opportunity to hold several service positions with this group and that has meant so much to me. Rotating in, rotating out. I've even tried to change things in the group and that didn't happen —"Rule 62" for sure! In our group's morning meeting, when I asked if we had a GSR, guess who was handed the job? Thank God these people have a sense of humor. I now get to learn and grow through service.

This month, my fellow members helped celebrate my joy that my son's name and sobriety date is now on the group's birthday board. I'm so glad he gets to share the gift of recovery with such wonderful people, just like I do. It is an experience like none other.

The sense of ease and comfort I used to get with the third drink, I now get in sobriety. I feel it anytime I walk into my home group or even think about the faces there. The original name of the bar is still outside on the building and there are AA meetings here every day and night. Sometimes people come in not knowing it isn't a bar any longer. The sign out front still says, "Where Happy Hour Never Ends."

So true.

It is anticipated that there will be worldwide acknowledgement of AA's 100th anniversary, and in keeping with our AA history we wish to be "friendly with our friends" and cooperate with the unique opportunities this may present.

The General Service Board of the U.S. and Canada has formed an ad hoc committee to consider the options to commemorate our Centennial anniversary. We are in the earliest stages but wanted to ensure you were aware that these discussions are underway. We will be seeking your input, ideas and participation along the way, so stay tuned. One hundred years, a day at a time, is an occasion that deserves our best efforts to celebrate our lifesaving program of recovery.

Please note that these efforts are separate from the 2035 U.S. and Canada International Convention. The U.S. and Canada service structure hosts an International Convention every five years, and the 2035 International Convention is sure to be an amazing weekend of celebration. The ad hoc committee is exploring additional and distinct commemorative efforts to occur throughout the 2035 centennial year.

We will keep you informed as our plans develop. Again, thank you so much for all that you do for AA.
