She thought she'd find a guy in the coffee shop. Instead, she found something even better.

Grapevine has played a momentous role in my sobriety. The first time I encountered Grapevine was about two years before I got sober in May of 2010. There's a local coffee shop downtown where I live. I would go there often in hopes of running into a boy I was obsessed with. He happened to live above the coffee shop.

At the time, I knew something needed to change with my drinking, but I wasn't ready to admit complete defeat yet. I had racked up four DUIs in six years. I'd been in and out of jail and I felt very lost. Despite all this I could not conceive of ever giving up alcohol. Having started at the ripe age of 14, I couldn't picture my life without drinking.

I was good at focusing on the parts of my life that looked good on the outside to convince myself that I didn't have a problem. I was financially self-supporting my way through college, and I hung around people who were, in my mind, worse than I was.

Never mind the "intoxilyzer" installed in my car or that I was failing out of school every other semester. I wanted the answer to my problem to be a new job, a new apartment, a new city, a new diet, a new boyfriend—anything except the booze.

The coffee shop happened to be across the street from an AA meeting hall, although I didn't know that at the time. In the shop was a pile of newspapers and magazines people had left there. That's where I found the Grapevine. I don't recall reading it at the coffee shop, but I do remember taking it home and reading it in my bedroom one night when I was feeling particularly depressed.


The prophet replied, "See that goat on the little mound down in the valley beneath us. Take this book from me and give it to the goat. He will resolve the argument."



I knew I was living like a hamster on a wheel, but I had no idea how to escape it. My solution was to investigate joining the Peace Corps. I thought that if I were in a "helping" profession" I would finally feel OK. The further away the assignment the better, since my city was part of the problem.

In the Grapevine story I read that night, a woman described how her life had changed after joining AA and how she had found a sense of purpose and a feeling of peace and happiness. Her story really spoke to me. I had always been trying to find my "purpose." I knew I needed "fixing" of some kind, but I could never find the answer.

A few years went by, and then one day I found myself on my knees, willing to change. I finally understood a crucial truth -that alcoholism was a disease and that I had it. Once I surrendered I saw that my story was similar to thousands of alcoholics just like me, who, through working the Steps, found the answer.

I was taught early on in AA that service is a vital part of recovery. At about three years sober, I started carrying the message into our local jail. I find Grapevine particularly useful for this kind of service. Often, the women I meet in there have a hard time relating to the language of the Big Book, but they do relate to articles written in today's language.

I was also a Grapevine chair for a year in our district. We used designated funds to purchase subscriptions for our local public libraries and coffee shops, and we gifted subscriptions to local AA members. Every morning, I open my email to read the daily quote from Grapevine. Even now I still need to get my thinking directed!

When I was about eight years sober I took a Grapevine and started a women's meeting at the tiny AA hall across from that coffee shop. It's been my home group for the past three years and what a blessing it's been. We read a story or two each week and share on it. Our meeting always closes with a joke from the back of the magazine and then a half hour or so of friendly laughter and chatter. At the end of each month, our group leaves Grapevines out in public places, perhaps setting the stage for one of God's miracles. I owe my sobriety to the women in this meeting.

A year and a half ago, my home group opened its loving arms to my mother. My younger brother died of alcoholism a little less than a year ago, and the hope and love of our meeting helped my mother get sober.

This experience, along with countless others, made me want to share the blessings and love I've found in AA, right here in Grapevine.




