Full of self-pity and scorn and wanting a drink, he had never been so grateful about picking up the phone.

I had never been closer to a drink in my year and a half of sobriety as I was that day. I had worked the Steps and sponsored other men. I attended meetings and maintained active relationships within our Fellowship, but something was still missing. And that day I needed help.

I was suddenly single for the first time in my sobriety and had also just found out that I wasn't accepted into a graduate program I had applied for. I felt rejected by my dream school and by my dream woman all at once. My mood oscillated between heartbreak and apathy, self-pity and scorn. I was desperate.

I reached out and called an "elder statesman" who had always extended a loving and tolerant hand when anyone asked. I was on my way to an AA meeting when I spoke to him and he suggested what then seemed like a novel idea: "Try to help someone else when you get there," he told me. "See if you can be of service, even if it's only washing coffee cups." To be honest, the idea seemed ludicrous, but I was desperate to avoid the hell of drinking again and so I became willing.

I felt insane when I walked into that AA meeting. The chatter of a thousand monkeys was raging in my sick alcoholic head. I even shared during the meeting and listened to others. But when I got up from the couch for the closing prayer, the thought that a drink would solve all my problems was very loud and drowning out every voice of sanity and reason. (continued on page 5)

Here are the responsibilities and requirements for each position:


Chairperson

- 1. Shall preside at Central Office Board and General Committee meetings.
- 2. Shall see that all decisions of the Committees are acted upon.
- 3. Pursuant to specific authority given on occasion by the Committees, may sign and deliver contracts and other documents in the name of North Carolina Mountain Central Office Inc.
- 4. With the recommendation and approval of the Central Office Board, shall call for eligible people to stand for positions and appoint chairpersons of standing and special subcommittees.
- 5. May vote, bring motions, initiate and engage in discussion and debate at Central Office Board and General Committee meetings in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order for Small Groups as specified in the By Laws.
- 6. Shall have five years continuous sobriety.



Alternate Chairperson

- Shall perform the duties of the Chairperson when requested by the Chairperson or in the case of their absence or inability to act, and shall preferably be interested in rotating to the Chairperson position if it becomes vacant.
- Shall have at least five years continuous sobriety.

Secretary

- Shall take minutes of all General Committee and Central Office Board meetings and submit to the Central Office within 14 days after the meeting.
- Shall have at least five years continuous sobriety.

Treasurer

- Shall have charge and custody of all funds of Central Office
- Accuracy of all financial records of Central Office.
- Arrange for preparation and filing of all required tax returns
- Preparation of an annual financial report and an annual budget.
- Preparation and presentation of monthly financial report to the Central Office Board and General Committee.
- Shall have at least five years continuous sobriety.

12th Step Call Coordinator

- Shall have responsibility for maintaining the 12th Step Call Volunteer list.
- · Recruits new volunteers.
- Work with the Office Manager to keep the 12th Step Call Volunteer list information current.
- Shall have at least three years of continuous sobriety.

(The Board will also be looking for a new *Mountain Doin's* Editor as the current Editor's suggested 3-year term has ended. This is a Board-appointed position.)

I can't explain why or how it happened. The man with a thousand monkeys raging who walked up to that sink of dirty coffee cups had been a complete slave to his mental obsession. But somehow, some way, as I washed those cups, I now believe my Higher Power washed the obsession away. That guy I called was right. My willingness to be of service was all it took.



Announcing: a new book from AAWS on sale November 1, 2024



The *Plain Language Big Book* is a tool to help readers understand the book *Alcoholics Anonymous*, which was first published in 1939. This new book is designed so that the A.A. Twelve Step program of recovery from alcoholism may be easily understood and accessible by all people who have a desire to stop drinking.

Members of A.A. fondly call the original book *Alcoholics Anonymous* "the Big Book." It is the basic text of the A.A. program. The *Plain Language Big Book* has been written to present the original ideas and same spiritual message of the Big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*.

This new text is not intended to replace the much beloved Big Book. Rather, the *Plain Language Big Book* is a book crafted over several years by A.A. members and publishing professionals to support alcoholics on the path to recovery. The book is intended to help people who have a problem with alcohol gain access to A.A.'s lifesaving message.

For years, A.A. members have expressed a need for a *Plain Language Big Book*. Based on the shared experience of A.A. members, some people may not have regular contact with other A.A. members to help them understand the A.A. program of recovery and the specific vocabulary as it is used throughout the original book *Alcoholics Anonymous*. Other people have a hard time reading, especially books that were written long ago. This *Plain Language Big Book* is written in simpler language to support readers in their recovery.

This book is published in accordance with Advisory Actions passed by substantial unanimity of the General Service Conference (GSC) of Alcoholics Anonymous. In 2021, the 71st GSC advised that this book be developed. Progress reports, then sample chapters were reviewed at the 72nd and 73rd GSCs. The final draft of the *Plain Language Big Book* was reviewed and approved by substantial unanimity at the 74th GSC, in April 2024. This process and outcome adopts this text as Conference Approved Literature.

The *Plain Language Big Book* covers the core content of what is the "abridged version" (the edition without personal stories) of the original Big Book.

Readers are also encouraged to seek out the current edition of the book *Alcoholics Anonymous* and meet with A.A. members to support their own individual paths of recovery from alcoholism.

The *Plain Language Big Book* is A.A. General Service Conference-approved literature.

Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.



If you have to go to a drinking party and can't take an A.A. with you, keep some candy handy.



Don't think you have to stay late. Plan in advance an "important date" you have to keep.



Worship in your own way.



Don't sit around brooding. Catch up on those books, museums, walks, and letters.



Don't start now getting worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember— "one day at a time."



Enjoy the true beauty of holiday love and joy. Maybe you cannot give material gifts—but this year, you can give love.



The International Convention will take place from July 3 - 6, 2025, at the Vancouver Convention Centre and BC Place Stadium.
