A Joyful Free Life

For this longtimer, sanity is the ability to adjust to reality. That's why he stays close and does the deal.

Sobriety is the most important thing in my life, but I see it as a means rather than an end. Stopping drinking is the prerequisite for recovery, and I know that everything I have would unravel if I started drinking again. But stopping drinking did nothing to help me recover from alcoholism itself.

Let me explain. When I stopped drinking, my life seemed to get worse rather than better for a time before I was able to start working the Steps. I was a high-bottom drunk, and an AA member once told me that if I hadn't been through hell when I was drinking then I was liable to do so in recovery.

That statement scared me at the time, but I can now see that, for someone who hits a really low bottom, sobriety is likely to be an improvement from day one. That wasn't true for me.

When I was new, most of the AA meetings I went to were dominated by people telling drinking stories, and I thought that meant the problem was alcohol and the solution was sobriety. I eventually came to see that sobriety was the problem once I stopped drinking. I now think of recovery as a spectrum. On one end of the spectrum is stark raving madness, a "dry drunk" of restlessness, irritability and discontentedness. On the other end is a happy, joyful and free life lived contentedly in the "fourth dimension." I need to maintain actions and attitudes that keep me near the positive end of the spectrum.

I now see Step One as what we use to diagnose the disease and the other Steps as what we use to treat it, a process that helps us return to sanity or get there for the first time. I see sanity as the ability to adjust to reality.



I lived in Japan for 20 years before moving to Tasmania to retire. In Japan, what we call mental illness is called "spirit illness," so I'm thinking that there isn't a lot of difference between a mental illness and a spiritual one.

One of the first things I learned in AA was that staying sober is a lot easier than getting sober and eventually arriving at a sane, sober life. That reminds me of a Japanese proverb that says, "A wise man climbs Mt. Fuji once."

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Welcome Home, Mary

A breakup with her girlfriend led to the woman who would help her learn the truth about her drinking.

My Higher Power (and my therapist) gently guided me to an AA meeting in January of 1997. I was a mess. I had just gone through a breakup and was feeling very sorry for myself. My pride was smashed as my now-former girlfriend had left me for her daughter's father, who was in prison. I was a working professional woman! What the heck was she thinking?

Up to that point, we were both drinking (mostly) daily. I knew she had a drinking and drug problem. I lied to myself often, thinking that since she drank more than I did that meant I, of course, did not have a problem. I had grown up with older brothers who had problems with drugs and alcohol, and I had sworn that I would not be like them. I was sure I would be able to control my drinking.

What I didn't mention was that when I was 17, I was caught with an open container of beer at the beach. I had to go before a judge who sentenced me to attend four AA meetings. While at my first meeting I heard a story by my neighbor, which I found pretty entertaining. After the meeting someone gave me some pamphlets. One said something like "You may be an alcoholic if ..." I took that home and studied it, as I was not going to be like my brothers.

For the next 22 years I tried to structure my drinking in such a way that I could fool myself into believing that I didn't have a problem. I didn't drink alone. If I couldn't find anyone to drink with I would go to a bar. I would pretend that I was happy and celebrating something so I could tell myself that I was drinking for a good reason and not because I was lonely or depressed. Also, I didn't drink before 5:00 p.m. (unless it was the weekend). You get the picture.

That breakup with my girlfriend was enough to smash my ego though. I called an old friend who was in AA now and working with alcoholics in a recovery center. She guided me back to the same therapist I had seen many years before, who at that time had directed me to another Twelve Step program, which I had long since abandoned.

The therapist gave me a choice. I needed to go to three Twelve Step meetings before I saw her again. Only one of

The following week, I saw my therapist and I told her how I felt in the AA meeting. She handed me a booklet that I had filled out many years before. It was my First Step that I really didn't remember ever filling out. She said, "Welcome home Mary, we've been waiting for you." That was over 22 years ago, and I'm still happily "at home."
