You Never Know

A performer at a theme park makes amends to his boss for his drunken behavior and gets the surprise of his life

I used to work at a theme park known as "The Happiest Place on Earth," whose company motto, "We Create Happiness," stood in stark contrast to the reality of my life then. I had a starring role in a popular show at the park, but my life choices and their consequences, including my alcoholism, prevented me from being any part of these ideals.

I lived in constant fear, convinced I was the only alcoholic in that happy place. Mired in self-pity and unable to stop drinking, I called in sick frequently and then just stopped showing up altogether. Instead of creating happiness, I created havoc.

I was a living example of the alcoholic described in Chapter 3 of our Big Book. I once told a version of this to my boss, stating that I'd resign if I were to drink on the job, evasively adding something about struggling with a "medical" issue. Finally, I took a leave of absence without telling anyone I was entering rehab.

In rehab I joined AA and worked the Steps. When I got to Step Nine I was ready to do the right thing and make amends to the people I had harmed. I had learned that I had to humbly ask for forgiveness and try to repair any damage I'd done, unless doing so would cause more harm.

Guided by my sponsor, I approached my coworkers at the theme park. Every one of them accepted my amends with understanding and compassion and for that I was extremely grateful. I saved my boss for last, unsure what his response would be as I barely knew him and didn't think we had much in common. I couldn't understand why I hadn't already been fired.

He and I met in his office. I revealed that I was in recovery and needed to do whatever it took to repair the harm I had done to him and to the show. I hoped he could forgive me, but told him I'd understand if he couldn't. No matter what,

12th Step Call Coordinator







I wanted him to know the truth behind my behavior. I made amends and took responsibility for my actions and behavior, including any consequences. Then I thanked him for his time and attention.

My boss looked thoughtful for a moment. "Ron," he said, "I want to tell you how much I appreciate the courage it took for you to tell me this. I also want to let you know that I received my 25-year chip last night."

I sat there stunned. Right then the words from "A Vision for You" rang in my head: "You will surely meet some of us ..." In AA, there are no coincidences. Guided by a power greater than myself, the action of choosing to make amends resulted in the consequence of creating happiness for two alcoholics. This moment was, in a word, miraculous. No longer feeling alone or afraid, I gratefully wished my boss a happy AA birthday.

Mentored by him, I continued working for the company—another miracle—and retired honorably several years later. We both still tear up at the memory of this shared spiritual experience, forever connected by AA's common bond as we continue on this journey.

If you're at all hesitant about doing Step Nine, keep asking your Higher Power for the willingness until it comes. I'm reminded of a line from one of the theme park's many movie productions: "Even miracles take a little time." In the meantime though, keep coming back.

AA also has a saying: "Don't leave before the miracle happens." Through Step Nine and its Promises you too can find your happiest place on earth in sobriety. One amends at a time. One miracle at a time.

The Way Things Are

A member in Missouri shares his thoughts about the way we talk about how AA used to be.

In the last year or so I've heard friends with less than a year sober (maybe after listening to an AA lead) confidently affirm that AA just isn't like it once was. Part of me goes, Oh, yeah, hmm ... OK. And then later I think, Wait, how could you know that? Then I remember how joyful they seemed to be in their first month or so, on that pink cloud. I was the same way.

Then I'd hear members talk about lower recovery rates, about the message getting watered down, about how this or that organization has gotten too much influence on our program, and a part of me would think, Yes, I feel that way too! It felt right and true at the time. But it's not, in my opinion, based on experience, something I never used to use. The Big Book calls this "great stuff" logic.

Part of the gift I've been given in recovery is the chance to go to meetings in different states and other countries. This has brought me a sense of adventure that has helped me get to different meetings even in the areas where I've lived. And while I believe my sobriety has been helped by every meeting, I have not been able to predict what would happen at the next meeting based on all the ones I'd gone to before. And that, I believe, is a blessing of Tradition Four. Logically, each group's autonomy means that I won't know before going to it what will happen. So there's no way to say with any certainty, "Yes, this is happening throughout AA, and it didn't used to ..." Well, except members have a lot more cell phones and things like that

And maybe that group autonomy was true in the AA Fellowship before the Traditions were written. Bill wrote them after seeing just how many conflicting rules there were in AA, didn't he? And that might be why, in the little time I've been blessed with getting to work on archives and learn more about our Fellowship's history, it seems like I've heard a number of conflicting claims about "how AA used to be."

From the start of our Fellowship, different groups were applying the program, whatever of it there was, in different ways. There may have been strong similarities, and maybe the Traditions helped those to grow, but the different stories about how they approached sponsorship, how high the recovery rate actually was, the number of readings that were or weren't used in meetings, how gruff the oldtimers were, and so on—maybe they're all true, even if everyone didn't agree.

And more than once in the last several years, I've been tempted to bolster arguments with "this is how AA used to be." Then thankfully I'm reminded, hopefully before I've gone through with it, that it might be one of many ways AA used to be. Thank God for autonomy!
